FISHERMEN'S KORNER ON THE DOCK

Mike Dellina's son and grandson have been spending time fishing on the dock. Mike's grandson, Mike, has had the pleasure of catching several catfish, including one very large sailcat and in addition he has also caught a large jack caravel and a blowfish.

IN THE GULF

Capt. Jack's boat is in dry dock, having some repairs completed, getting ready for the fall season.

Capt. Glen and crew fished offshore on at least three occasions. Their catch included several large red grouper, some scamp, and recently some large gag grouper, now that season is open (August 1 to October1). On one occasion **Burke Johnson** and his family had several good catches including many of the above named fish. They also caught mangrove snappers, black fin tuna and a very large wahoo over six feet long.

Glen, Glen's friend Aldo and Jack attended a tournament weigh-in at Marina Jack's. There were several categories including inshore, offshore, and far offshore. Some of the inshore catches, included snook (that was released), red fish, sea trout and black drum. The offshore fishermen caught numerous grouper, including gag, red, and black. They also caught several very large amberjack, weighing in as

much as 85 lbs. The third category, far off shore, included wahoo; black and yellow fin tuna, as well as sailfish and marlin (that were released).

Upon your arrival back at Harbor Lights, check our canal to see our new residents, a mother and baby manatee.

You might wish to check out at the South Jetty at a newly created wooden tree carving of a very large dolphin that is displayed in an island setting at the entrance.
