
Mandatory Orientation Workshop Saturday, Sept 08 8:45 am

COC Offering BS Degree

COC OFFERS 4-YEAR DEGREE

College of the Canyons and
California State University, Los
Angeles, have a partnership in the
works that would offer students a
chance to get a four-year
biological sciences degree
at COC's Valencia campus.

The goal is to begin the first class in the fall of 2013, according to Cathy Ritz, chief operating officer, foundation and University Center operations.

The center will offer the same courses that CSULA students would be taking, but local residents won't have to battle freeway traffic to get to the campus, Ritz said.

It's also a way for the university to satisfy a large community need, she said.

"The greatest number of students seeking an associate's degree are in biological sciences," Ritz said. "Those students will all take the same set of courses (a CSULA student would), which were selected based on a survey of students."



Taught by Steve Lively, recording artist, soloist and 'Lifted Up' choir director, this course is designed to give everyone a chance to sing! **The APS School Choir and Ensemble** is the perfect opportunity to try something new & different in a safe and non-threatening learning environment.



APS students in grades 8 - 12 will join 'Lifted Up' the high school / college choir from *The Bridge Bible Fellowship* (TBBF) in Reseda. APS Class sessions and choir **practices are on Monday evenings**. The Choir & Ensemble will lead in worship occasionally at morning church services, deliver an incredible Christmas outreach program, and go on tour in the spring (Memorial Day weekend). They may also perform at APS Graduation and other APS events.

REGARDING FORMS:

ALL ENROLLMENT RELATED FORMS SHOULD HAVE BEEN TURNED IN TO APS BY July 31. Forms that are turned in after a deadline are subject to a late fee of \$10 per week, per form. Why would APS charge late fees?

One of the biggest work-makers for APS is paperwork that is late or poorly done. Every time something is due, APS office workers (mostly Cindee Grant) must check who is on time and who is late or incomplete.

She must then make a list of the late families and contact them.

Then, she must re-check late incoming paperwork, make another contact list, re-contact those who are still late, etc. The solution: A late fee.

If you can believe it, Cindee and APS-Mom Jodi Syms have **processed over 1500 forms this summer**.

- 1) Grades were entered into CUMS, which require comparing courses, units and grades listed on the grade sheets against the courses and units listed on the Educational Expectations filed last year.
- 2) Lesson Plans and Educational Expectations for this year were reviewed and new CUMS created listing the courses written on your Educational Expectations forms for this year.
- 3) Other forms, like immunization / health forms, required by the State of California, were checked and rechecked.

Some families understand what is needed and turn in forms without any issues. Other families either seem to not understand or they fail to read their Survival Guide when filling out their forms. So then Cindee has to contact them to set things in order. One of the reasons our transcripts are so well accepted by universities and other schools is the care and attention to details that Cindee provides.

Special thanks to: Jodi Syms

who joined Cindee in reviewing Lesson Plans, Educational Expectations, Health records etc, entering database information like grades and CUMS, typing e-mails and letters, etc. All this was done so that everything will be in order by Orientation.

Obviously, this all takes a great deal of time and effort. The July 31 deadline gives APS only five weeks to complete the job. **Just answering the e-mail could take five weeks!**So, the answer to the question: "Why would APS charge late fees?" is obvious, don't you think?

How can you help?

The **BIG #1 thing you can do to help** reduce the workload is turn in all your forms **complete** and **on time**. Please don't send APS forms via e-mail – it might be easier for you, but it is not easier for us. If we accepted forms via e-mail all we would do all day is open e-mails and print forms.

When sending in **coupons**, make sure they **ARRIVE BEFORE the posted deadline**. We suggest you **mail your coupons on the first day they are published**. You cannot be too early. Why wait?

The BIG #2 thing you can do to help is, if you are late, please include the standard late fee of \$10 per form, per week. (Do the math – if one form is late one week, include \$10. If two forms are late one week, include \$20, etc. – this incremental late fee is our way of encouraging everyone to be ON TIME. We don't want the fees we want the forms. But if you are late, pay the fees.)

Some families act as if the fees just don't' apply to them, or so it seems, because they don't send in their fees when they turn in late forms. This then creates MORE office work because someone has to check, call them, then make a list and recheck it as the fees comes in.

The **BIG #3 thing you can do to help** is to **READ YOUR SURVIVAL GUIDE** before sending an e-mail with a question. New families can also ask their Friendly Families.

Military Bro Pic Forbidden

COC 4-YEAR DEGREES

SAN BERNARDINO, Calif. – Like many middle-

schoolers, 13-year-old Brianna Gentry likes to decorate her school notebook with pictures of herself, her family and her friends, but one of these photos is extra special. The high-achieving student keeps a **photo of** her brother Derrick, a military policeman stationed in Montana, in a prominent spot.

"My brother's very important to me," Brianna told KTLA. "I haven't seen him in a while."

So Brianna and her mother Jaima Eudy were shocked when an administrator at Golden Valley Middle School in San Bernardino told the girl she was breaking school rules by displaying the photo, as well as one of her softball team, even though there is no explicit rule against having photos on binders.

"The counselor took me out of class twice telling me that the pictures are added material." Brianna told KTLA. "But they haven't pulled any other students with pictures out from their class... Just me."

Eudy sent an angry letter to the school, claiming her daughter was being singled out and discriminated against. The school replied by sending home a list of the rules for the AVID program, a high-achieving club that Brianna is a part of, with the section on binders highlighted. However, Eudy says the rules never specifically said photos weren't allowed.

"I was very upset about it, because this is an AVID rule, not a rule for the whole entire school." Eudy told KTLA. "I think if you're going to enforce a rule, the rule should apply to all children."

After speaking with KTLA the school agreed to allow Brianna to keep her brother's photo, but not the one of her softball team. Brianna and her mother say they are happy with the compromise.

"I'd rather have my brother in my pictures than to have nothing at all," Brianna told the station. "So I'm fine with the decision."

The program allows students to pay CSULA's extended learning fees — roughly \$364 per month — while earning a four-year degree at COC, Ritz said.

The [COC] University Center offers 40 programs, including 19 bachelor degrees and a mix of advanced certification programs...

For the four-year school, it's another great way to attract students, said Nancy McQueen, chairwoman of the biological sciences department for CSULA.

The curriculum is currently awaiting approval from the Western Association of Schools and Colleges. which the center expects to have in hand within a few months, Ritz said.

The University Center offers 40 programs, including 19 bachelor degrees and a mix of advanced certification programs.

"This is a way to service more students." McQueen said. "Right now, there's such a crunch at the university."

The California State University system is not accepting new students for the spring semester.

Officials face a \$200 million cut if Gov. Jerry Brown's tax-hike plan on the November ballot fails.

There's an added advantage for students considering the biological sciences degree that they won't get in most other programs, according to Ritz.

Once an enrollment minimum is reached and classes begin, the center will guarantee a path of course offerings that will lead to a degree.

"The students are guaranteed the class, the classes will not be cut, and the students will be out in two years," Ritz said.

Aug 15, 2012 - \mathcal{L} ast week in Egypt, when Muslim Brotherhood supporters terrorized the secular media, several Arabic websites-including Arab News, Al Khabar News, Dostor Watany, and Egypt Now reported that people were being "crucified." The relevant excerpt follows in translation:

A Sky News Arabic correspondent in Cairo confirmed that protestors belonging to the Muslim Brotherhood crucified those opposing Egyptian President Muhammad Morsi naked on trees in front of the presidential palace while abusing others. Likewise, Muslim Brotherhood supporters locked the doors of the media production facilities of 6-October [a major media region in Cairo], where they proceeded to attack several popular journalists.

That there were attacks and violence—both in front of Egypt's presidential palace and at major media facilities—is well-documented. An August 9 report by El Balad, a widely read Egyptian website, gives the details:

Last Wednesday, August 8, "thousands of the Muslim Brotherhood's supporters" attacked 6-October's media facilities, beat Khaled Salah—chief editor of the privately-owned and secular Youm 7 newspaper prevented Yusif al-Hassani, an On TV broadcaster, from entering the building, and generally "terrorized the employees."

El Balad adds that the supporters of Tawfik Okasha, another vocal critic of President Morsi—the one who widely disseminated the graphic video of a Muslim apostate being slaughtered to cries of "Allahu Akbar"—gathered around the presidential palace, only to be surrounded by Brotherhood supporters, who "attacked them with sticks, knives, and Molotov cocktails, crucifying some of them on trees, leading to the deaths of two and the wounding of dozens."

Far from condemning these terrorists, Al Azhar, Egypt's most authoritative Islamic institution, has just issued a fatwa calling for more violence and suppression, saying that "fighting participants in anti-Muslim Brotherhood demonstrations planned for 24 August is a religious obligation."

Most of the aforementioned Arabic sites point out that these attacks are part of the Muslim Brotherhood's campaign to intimidate and thus censor Egypt's secular media from exposing the group's Islamist agenda, which Youm 7, On TV, and Okasha do daily. [Note: the latter's channel was recently shut down, despite Morsi's previous reassurances that "no station or media will be shut down in my era."]

These threats are not new; back in April, an organization called the "Jihad Group to Cleanse the Country" threatened these media with "painful and

severe punishments." Apparently now that Morsi has become master of Egypt, threats are becoming reality, just as promises are being broken.

And the threats are taking their toll. Sky News, which was first to report about the crucifixions, has taken down its original article (though the URL still appears in the address box with the Arabic words "protesters-crucified-in front of-egypt's-presidentialpalace").

While one may argue that Sky News removed the article because it was found false, one can equally argue that it censored itself for fear that it would be next in the terror campaign against the media.

In reality, there is little reason to doubt this crucifixion story. Militant Muslims crucifying their opponents is a regular feature of the Islamic world—recent cases coming from the Ivory Coast, where two Christian brothers were crucified, similarly by supporters of a Muslim president who ousted a Christian; Indonesia, where Islamic separatists crucified a fellow Muslim for being a military informant; and in Iraq, where Muslim militants crucified Christian children.

Moreover, those alleged to have been crucified in Egypt certainly fit the Koran's description of who deserves to be crucified. According to Allah, "The punishment of those who wage war against Allah and His messenger and strive to make mischief in the land is only this: that they should be murdered or crucified or their hands and their feet should be cut off..." (Koran 5:33).

"Making mischief in the land" is precisely what the secular media is being accused of, by constantly exposing the Muslim Brotherhood and prompting the people to protest. Even the Jihad Group to Cleanse the Country, which threatens to "liquidate" many secular media, accuses them of "creating chaos to implement the American and Zionist agenda."

Finally, it is telling that only a few months ago, and for the first time in Egypt's modern history, an Egyptian MP proposed to institutionalize Sharia's most draconian punishments—including crucifixion.

Under the Muslim Brotherhood in Egypt, the bottle has been uncorked and the Islamic Genie set loose. Expect much worse to come.

"The Copts (Egyptian Christians) must get out of Egypt as soon as possible – for the many millions who will not be able to get out, I expect things will continue to deteriorate – just as they did for Germany's and Europe's Jews from the 1930s onward," said Center for Security Policy Senior Fellow Clare Lopez.

 \mathcal{A} 46-year-old Orange County nursing instructor was sentenced to four months in jail for sexually touching three female teenage students, who were 17 and 18 years old.

Alfredo Fernandez Gonzalez, a certified nursing assistant and resident of Orange, was accused of placing his hands on the students' hips, kissing them on the neck and pulling the females toward him. He allegedly grabbed and touched their buttocks "under the quise of simulating nursing procedures," a statement by the district attorney's office said.

He talked about dating them and told them they had attractive bodies, the statement said.

The teens were in a nursing technical education course, known as a Regional Occupational Program, at Park West Care and Rehabilitation Center in Santa Ana. The program provides career training to high school students.

The females told their mothers about the touching, which, according to prosecutors, occurred over a two-month period in the spring of 2011. They then notified Santa Ana police.

Gonzalez's sentence came after he pleaded quilty to three misdemeanor counts of lewd conduct. In addition to 120 days in jail, he is to receive three years of probation.

 ${\mathcal M}$ ore than 1.7 million illegal immigrants became eligible for tentative legal status Aug 15, 2012 when President-for-now Obama's non-deportation policy went into effect. Congress rejected the President's Dream Act, which was his attempt to liberalize immigrations laws, so President-for-now Obama, simply relaxed the rules by Presidential decree; raising a furor in DC. Activists say the policy is the biggest change on immigration in decades.

On Tuesday Aug 14, 2012, President-for-now Obama laid out final details, including relaxed education standards that set a low bar.

Under the rules, illegal immigrants in job training or who have enrolled in a GED course are eligible for legal status — a lesser requirement than obtaining a high school diploma or equivalency certificate.

The government began taking applications Aug 15. Immigrant rights groups have scheduled legal clinics across the country to help determine if immigrants qualify and to aid them in filling out forms.

"Our job is to make sure that everyone who's eligible for this program knows about it and applies for it if they feel comfortable after weighing the risks and benefits," said Chung-Wha Hong, executive director of the New York Immigration Coalition. "So far, the benefits have kind of outweighed the risks, based on the hundreds and thousands of people coming forward."

The policy halts deportations for illegal immigrants who fall within certain age ranges, who don't have a major criminal record, and who can show they have been in the country studying or in job training.

Those who qualify also can obtain a permit to work in the U.S. In certain states, that could be good enough to obtain a driver's license or in-state tuition at state schools.

Republicans said it will push hundreds of thousands of new legal workers into an already tough job market, where they will compete with Americans. They also said the administration is not requiring inperson interviews for applicants and is accepting affidavits for some requirements, which they said is an invitation to fraud.

"While potentially millions of illegal immigrants will be permitted to compete with American workers for jobs, there seems to be little if any mechanism in place for vetting fraudulent applications," House Judiciary Committee Chairman Lamar Smith and Sen. Chuck Grassley said in a letter to Homeland Security Secretary Janet A. Napolitano. Homeland Security estimates about 11 million illegal immigrants reside in the U.S.


