Missing and incomplete forms will accrue late fees at the rate of \$10 per form, per week, beginning **July 31.**

Why would APS charge late fees?

One of the biggest time-consumers for APS is paperwork that is late or poorly done. Every time something is due, APS office workers must check who is on time and who is late or incomplete.

They must then make a list of the late families and contact them. Then, they must re-check late incoming paperwork, make another contact list, re-contact those who are still late, etc. The solution: A late fee.

If you can believe it, APS will process over 2000 forms this summer. Grade sheets need to be entered into CUMS with course titles, units and grades verified against the Educational Expectations filed last Sept.

Lesson Plans and Educational Expectations for the new school year must be reviewed and new CUMS created. Other forms, like immunization / health forms, required by the state of California, need to be checked and rechecked.

All this so that everything for the new school year will be in place by Orientation.

Obviously, this all takes a great deal of time. The July 31 deadline gives APS only five weeks to complete the job. Just answering the e-mail could take five weeks!

Families who miss the deadline or who have missing or incomplete forms will be contacted by APS and charged a late fee.

Families who have forms that need to be redone will be likewise contacted and charged a late fee.

Students in CA school for first time:

Proof of a TB test is required for all students entering a CA school for the 1st time. **C**alifornia **H**ealth and **D**isease **P**revention (CHDP) report, including a doctor's signature, is required for all students enrolling in grades K or 1 in California for the 1st time (contact APS Office for the form).

12th grade students:

High School Planning Chart completed for grades 9 - 12.

We can't know until we are done processing all the forms, and by then the \$10 per form, per student, per week late fee will apply.

You should always keep a copy of anything you send to the APS office.



News from the planet Bizarro

. SAN ANTONIO – A Texas teacher will lose her job after ordering more than 20 kindergartners to line up and hit a classmate accused of being a bully, a district spokesman announced.

The teacher at a suburban San Antonio school is accused of orchestrating the slugfest after a younger teaching colleague went to her seeking suggestions on how to discipline the 6-year-old, according to the Judson Independent School District.

Both teachers at Salinas Elementary were placed on paid administrative leave, though the one who allegedly arranged the punishment will not work for the district next school year, said district spokesman Steve Linscomb. Prosecutors are reviewing the allegations and will determine whether formal charges will be filed.

The police report alleges the teacher chose to show the child "why bullying is bad" by instructing his peers to "Hit him!" and "Hit him harder!" It also states that the second teacher intervened only after one of the children hit the boy hard on his upper back.

"Twenty-four of those kids hit him and he said that most of them hit him twice," Amy Neely, the mother of 6-year-old Aiden said.

Neely said her son is not a problem child and that this was the first she'd heard of teachers having issues with him.

Linscomb said other students had perceived the boy as being a bully. That's when the teacher went with her students to a nearby classroom and sought disciplinary advice from her colleague, he said.

Neely, the boy's mother, said she wants to make sure the teacher who ordered the hitting does not work in a classroom again.


"She doesn't need to be around any children," Neely told reporters.

The mother added -- and the police report confirmed -- that some of Aiden's classroom friends told him they didn't want to hit the boy but did so because they were afraid not to.

Neely said she learned about what happened to her son after a teacher who witnessed the incident and intervened went on to report it. She filed an official oppression complaint against the teachers with the district police department two weeks after the event.

The district placed both teachers on paid administrative leave and launched an investigation. District officials have not released the names of either teacher. The one who asked for help disciplining the boy and then waited to report the incident after witnessing it was reprimanded.

Take Naman knew something was about to happen. The 18-year-old from Redlands, Calif., was waiting to hear from Dan Savage, the founder of the "It Gets Better" anti-bullying campaign.




Savage had been invited to speak to several thousand high school journalists attending a national conference hosted by the National Scholastic Press Association and the Journalism Education Association.

Naman, who is a yearbook photographer at Arrowhead Christian Academy, thought Savage was going to talk about his anti-bullying campaign. But the Christian teenager soon learned that Savage had a very different message for the students.

"I hope you're all using birth control," Savage told the teenagers as he began his remarks. From there, he regaled the young people with stories about his husband, describing how he looked in a Speedo. At one point, Savage imagined what it would be like with his husband on stage telling the kids that they would have to pry him off his partner.

Naman was growing increasingly uncomfortable with the tone and tenor of Savage's remarks. There were more lewd comments, profane words and innuendo. And then, Savage said something that made Naman take notice.

Now you will more and more be directly responsible for who you are and what you are. **Your habits, morals, direction, attitude...that will be less under our control.**

So you will be the person you choose to be. Integrity is often described as who you are when you are alone. Of course, we are never alone as children of God. He is always watching. But the temptations will now be easily joined with opportunity. How will you respond?

You will also be on your own to stay close to God, church, etc. When you find yourself making excuses to be other places other than amongst brothers and sisters in the Lord, learning and being fed, watch out. It happens fast. Soon your faith will be your own and not that of your parents. What will you choose to do?

"The Bible," Savage said with a elongated pause.

"The very second he said the Bible and paused, I knew it was going to get ugly," Naman told Fox News. "It was about to be a bashing."

And Naman was absolutely correct.

"We can learn to ignore the bulls t in the Bible about gay people – the same way we have learned to ignore the bulls t in the Bible about shellfish, about slavery, about dinner, about farming, about menstruation, about virginity, about masturbation," Savage told the young students. "We ignore bulls t in the Bible about all sorts of things."

Jake Naman said he felt - bullied.

The 18-year-old Eagle Scout and captain of the high school track team rose to his feet - and walked out - passing by hundreds of other students who were cheering the anti-bullying advocate's profanity-laced rant.

Some will say what happened next took courage – but Naman said he was simply following the prompting of the Holy Spirit. And the entire moment was captured on a video that has now gone viral on YouTube.

The 18-year-old Eagle Scout and captain of the high school track team rose to his feet – and walked out - passing by hundreds of other students who were cheering the anti-bullying advocate's profanity-laced

"I felt like in my heart I couldn't just stay there at all," he said. "It was a really weird feeling I just had to get out. I didn't want to cause a scene but I really could not stand to be in that room anymore."

Jake Naman said he felt - bullied.

"If Dan Savage had gotten up there and said 'God hates homosexuals and they're all going to hell,' there would have been huge outrage from that crowd," he said. "As Christians we get the other side of that. When our faith is attacked like that - we are ridiculed for taking a stand against it."

Naman thought that he was the only person who walked out - but when he got to the lobby - he learned that was far from the case. Arrowhead's entire yearbook staff followed his lead – including his 16-year-old sister.

"I was shaking," Julia Naman told Fox News. "I saw my brother pop up and leave and I took off after him."

So did 17-year-old Haley Mulder.

"I never felt more hurt, felt persecuted," Mulder said. "For me, my faith is what I want to be defined by. For someone to say it was B.S. is really hurtful. I felt put down and bullied because of my faith."

And then it got worse for the Christian teenagers. Savage directly targeted them with his remarks.

'You can tell the Bible guys in the hall they can come back now because I'm done beating up the Bible," he said. "It's funny as someone on the receiving end of beatings that are justified by the Bible how pansy-assed people react when you push back.'

Naman said a number of the girls began crying. He said it seemed like such a safe environment "But then Dan Savage went off and it didn't seem that way anymore."

"He had a position of power as a speaker and he was using that against a group of students who had never done anything to him," Naman said. "I would consider that bullying."

"He was completely insulting and degrading our faith," his sister said.

Mulder said Savage needed to practice what he preaches.

"I felt it was ironic coming from a person who was talking about not bullying," she said.

In all about a hundred students walked out of the speech, but Naman said many others wanted to. He said some Christian teenagers felt intimidated and were afraid of what might happen if they had left.

Still, the 18-year-old said one thing was certainly obvious – "The majority of the students did not support us at all," he said.

Savage issued a partial apology over the weekend, saying he was referring to the walk-out as "pansy-assed" and not the students. However, he stood by his profane references to the Bible.

Dan Savage is a radical gay rights activist. This is not the first or the worst or the most radical of this man's hateful outbursts. One of many examples is a column (Feb 2, 2010) where he wrote that "we need to acknowledge the existence of good pedophiles".

Why was this man chosen by the National Scholastic Press Association and the Journalism **Education Association to speak to several** thousand high school journalists attending their national conference? Obviously, they want this kind of poison to seep into the school newspapers and yearbooks of high schools across the nation!






