Mission

AWHPI Inc. is a 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization dedicated to bring health and healing to citizens in impoverished areas by promoting ways to strengthen the health care delivery system among women, and to procure medical and surgical supplies and equipment for donation to medical facilities in less developed countries.



History

Princess Moradeun Ogunlana started AWHPI in 1999 after a trip to her native land Nigeria where she witnessed an incredible lack of basic medical supplies. Accompanied by founding board member, Dr. Babajide Ogunlana, Princess Deun Ogunlana returned from this journey determined to address this shortage all too prevalent in the developing world. Armed with the knowledge that an estimated \$9 billion in medical surplus is produced annually in the US, Princess Ogunlana, along with Dr. Ogunlana and three other board members established and incorporated the African Women's Health Project International on September 2003 in Arkansas to give this surplus a new purpose.

The Problem

While the majority of people who live in poor nations of the world have been preoccupied with the struggle for basic necessities of life (food, water, clothes, and shelter), cancer has silently grown to be an enormous problem, specifically – breast and cervical cancer. Each year over 500,000 women are diagnosed with breast and cervical cancer, and 80% of them reside in developing countries. The majority of these women die within a short period of time due to lack of adequate medical care. Most are young married and have children. Thus, in Africa where mothers are relied upon to provide for and raise the children, cancers not only steal their lives, but tragically disrupt the entire family.

- Can you imagine a mother of 10 children never in her life having seen a doctor for pre-natal or post-natal care?
- A woman in her 40's not having heard of a PAP smear?

• A child with a minor cut that turns into serious infection for lack of an antiseptic? Such situations are common in impoverished areas of West Africa. The African Women's Health Project International (AWHPI) is making a change in the lives of many of these families by getting needed medical care and medicines to them. Education, food, clothing, and other humanitarian support also are among the range of services that the foundation provides for the women and children of these countries.

The ultimate long-term goal of the foundation is to set-up FREE Medical Clinics and hospitals in impoverished areas in West Africa, notably Nigeria and Ghana by bringing in qualified Medical Doctors, Nurses and others in healthcare fields from the United States of America to provide volunteer services to these women. Our immediate goal is to get needed help to these locations through free quarterly medical clinics and support missions. Through donations from hospitals, private practitioners, manufacturers, retailers, pharmaceuticals companies, and other sources, it is possible. To date, we have collected and donated more than 5,000lbs of supplies.

Will you help us with a donation of medical equipments, medicines, supplies and/or monetary resources to transport the resources to the areas of need in West Africa? The supply needs' list is comprehensive. At the top are medical equipments and supplies,

prescription and non-prescription medicines, personal hygiene items, and computer and office supplies and school supplies. Then there's the cost of transporting the resources to the areas of direst need. At AWHPI we realized that if we are to make significant changes in the motherland, we need your help. What we witnessed on Medical Mission:

Each Spring, as AWHPI embarks on a 12-day Medical Mission to Africa, and the conditions that we witnessed impacted on our minds the need for this organization:

- Along the clinic walls, women struggle in labor on stained, makeshift beds.
- Ill and premature babies lay in rickety paint-chipped cribs and deteriorated incubators.
- An old man, weak and near lifeless, is carried in on a makeshift stretcher.
- Doctors and nurses work steadily through the night, doing what they can for every patient. But the clinic is under-equipped.
- Medications and dressings must be carefully rationed.
- Operations are delayed or cancelled because there are no sutures.
- A rusted van with no life-saving equipment serves as an ambulance.

These are the medical hardships healthcare providers and their patients face every day in many areas around the world.
