Effective Learning Environments for Student Success

Hillsboro Schools prides itself on offering challenging curricula that will prepare students for life after graduation. We focus on the teaching & learning process and educating the whole child while ensuring smooth building transitions. Our district provides an instructionally challenging continuum that promotes a positive learning environment. Our collective commitment toward continuous improvement has been noted in our Annual Performance Report, compiled by the Missouri Department of Elementary and Secondary Education, where our district earned 88.6% in 2014, increased to 89.6% in 2015 and now has reached a level of 91.1% in 2016. Our district strives for sustained growth by continuously monitoring district processes, including the teaching/learning process, in an effort to gather data to improve all areas of schooling.
