

InsideOut Mission Adventures

This semester on Wednesday nights we have been on mission adventures where we learn about God's love while experiencing different ways people love others around the world and locally. For our last unit we highlighted the Brewer family in South East Asia and ended with the missions work being done at Rust Street and Daily Bread Wesley Soup Kitchen in San Angelo, TX.

This month we are focusing on Mexico as we learn about Casa Hogar El Corazon De Rey in Acuña, Mexico. This children's home is a Christian nonprofit orphanage run by Dr. Ron and Anna Sherman. Ron and Anna faithfully care for up to 35 children in their home. Many of these children have experienced neglect, abuse, and hunger. Ron, Anna, and four house parents not only provide for the physical needs of these children, but also provide the safe structure and nurture of Christian adults that creates the context for healing. Every other month Students and Adults from Southland join this children's home for the day to encourage the house parents, play with the children, shop and cook for everyone, and help tutor the kids. Please consider sending mission offerings with the kids for this month to go towards the needs of this ministry.
