The Grand Dam in San Diego, the Hotel del opened its doors in 1888, and was designated a historic landmark in 1963. Filled with art and history, the hotel regularly hosts seasonal activities for the public, including Sunday brunch in the historic Crown Room. A historic tour is provided of the hotel to the public. Due to the way the building was constructed, no wall is exactly parallel, so a microphone is not needed. Sound travels from one end of the hall to the other without distortion."

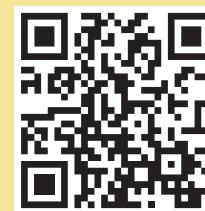

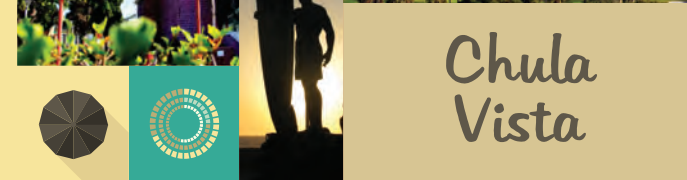
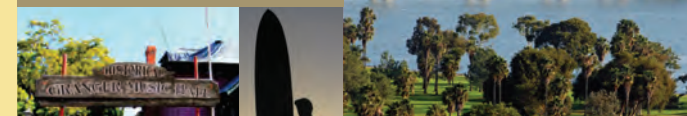
