The **paper** will be graded based on clarity of explanation, quality of writing, and following instructions (as set forth in last week's handout).

The **presentations/videos** will be assessed as follows:

[15 points] The presentation adequately addresses all major sections of the paper:

introduction, causes, implications/consequences, prediction, personal reflection

[15 points] Slides/props are well-arranged, easy to follow, and complement what the presenter

is saying (that is, the presenter uses, but does not simply read off of, the slides)

Peer review of presentations/videos: Additionally, 10 points on this project comes from your assessment of the other presentations given in class. Presentations will be given on Thursday, July 25th, Monday, July 29th, and Thursday, August 1st. Attendance and active participation in the peer review component of the project will earn you all 10 points. Failure to attend or participate will result in fewer points being awarded.
