- This relaxation of the criteria for "reasonableness" will be reflected in the Somewhereville Local Assembly's determination of the "in good standing" status of economic enterprises and other organizations (such as schools, etc.).

A Good Reputation, Not High Profits, Is the Basis for Being in Good Standing

- The basis for the Assembly determining that an economic enterprise or organization (such as a school) is in good standing* is primarily its reputation for providing its product or service reasonably, based in turn on the quality of the product or service, how useful or desirable it is, how well it is made available to the appropriate people, etc.
- To judge an organization's reputation, the Assembly currently consults all relevant sources, including the various certification organizations, newspaper reports, and communications from concerned individuals. **Please submit suggestions** how to improve on this.

THAT IN AN EGALITARIAN SOMEWHEREVILLE IT WOULD BE THE LAW THAT

Involuntary Unemployment is Abolished

- Any resident of Somewhereville who sincerely wishes to be in good standing* by acting reasonably according to the principle of "from each according to ability, to each according to need" shall be provided with a mutually agreeable way for him/her to do so.
- If such a person cannot find an economic enterprise or organization (such as a school) of his/her own choosing that agrees to accept him/her as a worker (or student), then the Assembly will either order one to accept him/her, or set him/her up as a new entrepreneur, or grant him/her "good standing" status pending a search for a better solution.

THAT IN AN EGALITARIAN SOMEWHEREVILLE IT WOULD BE THE LAW THAT

The Local Assembly Alone Decides How Land and Buildings in Somewhereville Shall be Used

- The assembled egalitarians of Somewhereville, acting democratically and as equals (nobody is rich or poor), determine how land, buildings and other resources of Somewhereville shall be used.
- People who volunteer to work reasonably to use these resources for the purpose determined by the Assembly thereby satisfy the "from each according to ability" requirement to be in good standing*.
- The organization that uses these resources reasonably for the purpose determined by the Assembly may take for free whatever goods and services it reasonably requires to do so.
