Our goal is to jumpstart female entrepreneurs from SMEs to pan-African industry leaders.

Why We Exist

Entrepreneurship will be *the* broad based driver of economic growth for Africa with the potential to create jobs for the more than 200 million young Africans between ages 15 and 24. However, whilst Sub Saharan Africa has the highest rate of female entrepreneurship across the world (27%), the typical business profile is a consumer-oriented, one-woman enterprise with no employees and low expectations for future growth.

There are numerous NGO and skill building programs focused on micro and small businesses, but limited attention has been paid to investing in high growth female entrepreneurs who have the greatest potential to create large enterprises. It is these women who have the power to become global leaders and effect change on a mass scale.**

Our Solution

She Leads Africa will launch operations in September with a pitch contest for female-led high growth startups on the continent and diaspora. 10 talented finalists will be paired with mentors from premier consulting, finance and venture capital companies for 6 weeks of training and business plan development. At the end of the training, entrepreneurs will be brought to Lagos to present their businesses in front of investors, mentors, media outlets and judges including:

- + **Hakeem Belo-Osagie**: Serial entrepreneur and Africa's 34th wealthiest man. Mr Belo-Osagie currently sits on the global advisory board for the Council of Foreign Relations and the Brookings Institute
- + **Ngozi Edozien**: Founder of InVivo partners and non-executive director at Barloworld, PZ Cussons, and Vlisco. Ms Edozien is also the former head of West Africa for emerging market focused PE fund Actis
- + **Bola Adesola**: Chief Executive Officer of Standard Chartered Nigeria and a member of the Aspen Global Leadership Network

As a startup itself, She Leads Africa has already made significant traction in the entrepreneurial ecosystem with more than 380 entrepreneurs from more than 27 countries applying for a coveted finalist spot. Winners will receive more than \$55,000 in cash and in kind prizes including legal services, tablets and computers, data subscriptions, and exclusive meetings with leading investors. Sponsors and supporters include international and pan-African businesses including Google, GT Bank, Etisalat, ASKY Airlines, and Genevieve Magazine as sponsors. A leading venture capital firm has already committed to investing \$25,000 in an entrepreneur from the She Leads Africa community.

With plans to become the 500 Startups of Africa, She Leads Africa aims to become a staple of the African investment community with VC funds already seeking access to their database of female entrepreneurs and plans underway to hold networking events for African female entrepreneurs in major global cities, create a mentorship platform, and raise an investment fund.

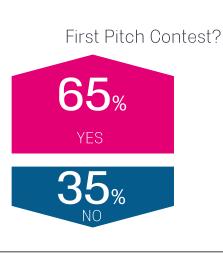

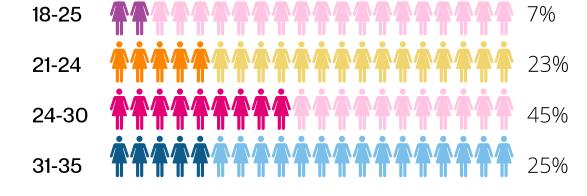
What are the top challenges female entrepreneurs face in their businesses?
