

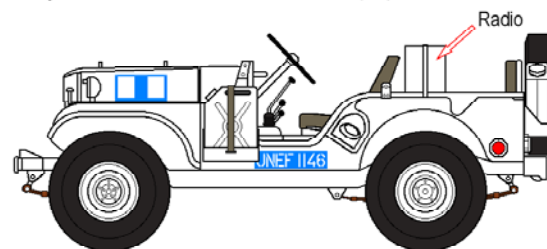
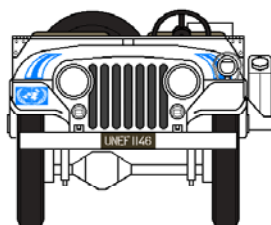
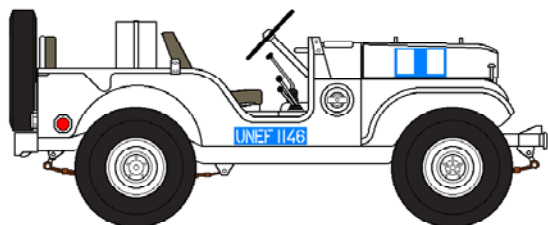

The windshield has not been folded down but has been completely removed

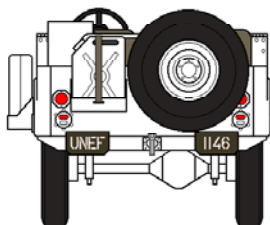

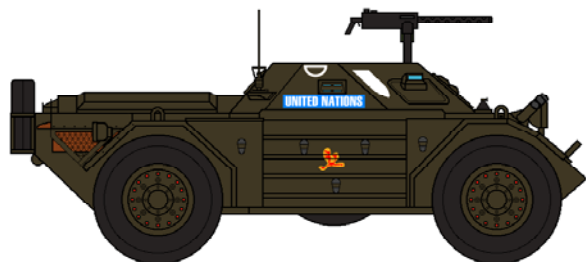

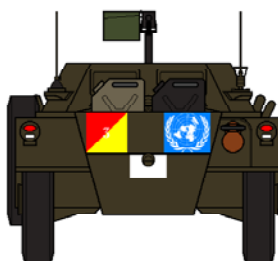
All vehicles are wearing the old Korea vintage formation sign on both sides as shown.

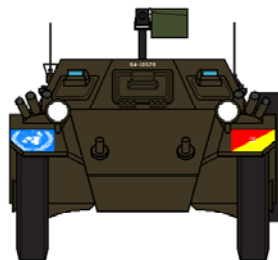

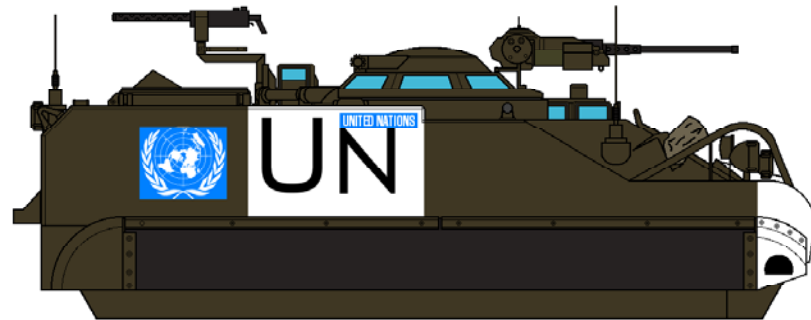

Serial Number

This Lynx C&R was brought over by the Lord Strathcona's Horse (RC) when they were sent in to augment the Canadian Airborne Regiment after Turkey invaded the island. Despite a lack of armour and heavy support weapons in a war scenario the Airborne Regiment continuously separated, bluffed and fought to restore peace... finally they succeeded. Two Canadian jumpers were killed during this tour.

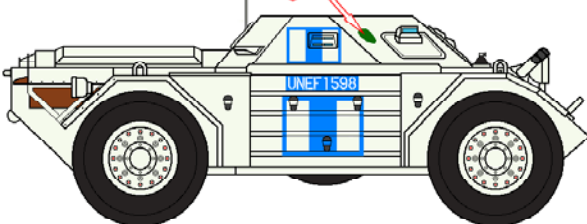


Ferret Mk.1 - The Royal Canadian Dragoons, United Nations Emergency Force, The Sinai Desert, Egypt, 1959



Although the same crest as appeared again in 1967, it is much smaller

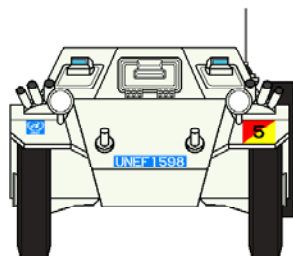
The crest shown on the right front fender is still a guess, it is not clear in the photo.

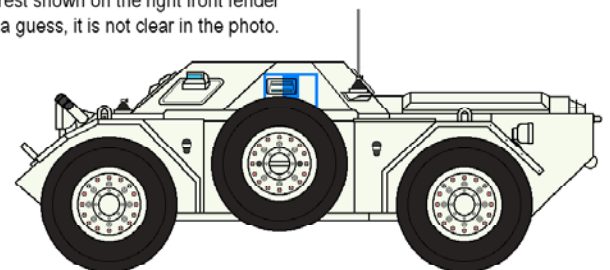
