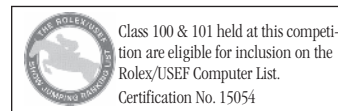

Combining/Dividing Sections: Sections may be divided by age of rider and may also be combined (Children's with Adult Amateur sections) if so stated in the prize list.

Awards: Zone awards to be given for Low Children's Jumper section.

LOW ADULT AMATEUR JUMPER

Eligibility: To be ridden by exhibitors who have reached their 18th birthday by December 1 of the current competition year and who hold a current USEF Amateur certification. Open to horses and ponies.

Cross Entry: Horse/rider combinations may cross enter into the High Adult Amateur Jumpers at the same competition. Horse/rider combinations may enter only one classic, if both Low and High are offered. Riders in Low Adult Amateur Jumper may not cross enter into any classes held above 1.15m (3'9") at the same competition.

Height of Fences: To be set at 1.00m (3'3")

Combining/Dividing Sections: Sections may be divided by age of rider and may also be combined (Children's with Adult Amateur sections) if so stated in the prize list.

Awards: Zone awards to be given for Low Adult Amateur Jumper section.

HIGH CHILDREN'S JUMPER

Eligibility: To be ridden by exhibitors who have not reached their 18th birthday by December 1 of the current competition year. Open to horses and ponies.

Cross Entry: Horse/rider combinations may cross enter into the Low Children's Jumpers at the same competition. Horse/rider combinations may enter only one classic, if both Low and High are offered. Children's Jumper riders may not cross enter into High Junior classes or any other jumper class exceeding 1.30m at the same competition with the exception of classes which do not offer prize money (including add back money) see HU111 and HU108 for cross entry restrictions.

Combining/Dividing Sections: Sections may be divided by age of rider and may also be combined (Children's with Adult Amateur sections) if so stated in the prize list.

Height of Fences: To be set at 3'6" or 1.10 -1.15m

Awards: Zone awards to be given for High Children's Jumper section

HIGH ADULT AMATEUR JUMPER

Eligibility: To be ridden by exhibitors who have reached their 18th birthday by December 1 of the current competition year and who hold a current USEF Amateur certification. Open to horses and ponies.

Cross Entry: Horse/rider combinations may cross enter into the Low Adult Amateur Jumpers at the same competition. Horse/rider combinations may enter only one classic, if both Low and High are offered. Adult Amateur Jumper riders may not cross enter into High Amateur Owner classes or any other jumper class exceeding 1.30m at the same competition with the exception of classes which do not offer prize money (including add back money) see HU111 and HU108 for cross entry restrictions.

Combining/Dividing Sections: Sections may be divided by age of rider and may also be combined (Children's with Adult Amateur sections) if so stated in the prize list.

Height of Fences: To be set at 3'6" or 1.10 -1.15m

Awards: Zone awards to be given for High Adult Amateur Jumper section

ADULT AMATEUR HUNTER

Eligibility: To be ridden by exhibitors who have reached their 18th birthday by December 1 of the current competition year and who hold a current USEF Amateur certification. Open to horses and ponies.

Cross Entry: Riders entered in Adult Amateur Hunter sections may not compete in any other class in which obstacles exceed 3'5" at the same competition, (Exception: Equitation, Jumper classes 1.20m and lower, Amateur Owner Hunter, Amateur Owner Jumper classes, the USHJA National Hunter Derby and the USHJA International Hunter Derby). Riders competing in the Amateur Owner Hunter or Amateur Owner Jumper sections may compete on one different horse in the Adult Amateur Hunter section. Horses cannot cross enter into 3'3" or 3'6" Amateur Owner sections at the same competition.

Judging: To be judged on performance and soundness, suitability to count.

Height of Fences: 3'0"; spreads not to exceed height of fence.

Combining/Dividing Sections: When a section is divided by age of rider no horse may compete in more than one section. When sections are split by age they must be split as Adult Amateur 18-35, Adult Amateur 36-49 and Adult Amateur 50 & Over. The Adult Amateur

section may be combined with Children's Hunter Horse if there are four (4) or less in either section.

Jog: Horses and Ponies may be jogged at the horse show management's discretion.

Awards: Zone Horse of the Year Awards will be presented annually to the Adult Amateur Hunter 18-35 section, the Adult Amateur 36-49 section and the Adult Amateur 50 & Over section.

Under Saddle Classes: If an under saddle class is divided by age and a rider has two or more horses entered, all riders must be amateurs but need not be eligible by age.

Handy Hunter Classes: Handy Hunter Classes are optional and can be added at the competition management's discretion.

CHILDREN'S HUNTER HORSE

Eligibility: To be ridden by exhibitors who have not reached their 18th birthday by December 1 of the current competition year.

Cross Entry: Riders entered in Children's Hunter Horse sections may not compete in any other class in which obstacles exceed 3'5" at the same competition (Exception: Equitation classes up to 3'9", Jumper classes 1.20m and lower, Junior Hunter sections, USHJA National Hunter Derby 1

Classic and USHJA International Hunter Derby). A Children's Hunter Horse rider may only compete one different horse in the Junior Hunter Sections. A Junior Hunter rider may only compete one different horse in the Children's Hunter Horse section. Horses entered in Children's Hunter classes may not cross enter into Junior Hunter sections at the same competition. Riders entered in the Children's Hunter Horse section may only compete on one Children's Hunter Pony at the same competition.

Judging: To be judged on performance and soundness, suitability to count.

Height of Fences: 3'0"; spreads not to exceed height of fence.

Combining/Dividing Sections: When sections are offered by age they must be offered as Children's Hunter Horse 14 Years & under and Children's Hunter Horse 15-17. Sections can be combined if entries warrant.

Jog: Horses and Ponies may be jogged at the horse show management's discretion.

Awards: Zone Horse of the Year Awards will be presented annually the Children's Hunter 14 and Under section and the Children's Hunter 15-17 section.

Handy Hunter Classes: Handy Classes are optional and can be added at the Competition Management's discretion.

CHILDREN'S HUNTER PONY

Eligibility: To be ridden by exhibitors who have not reached their 18th birthday by December 1 of the current competition year.

Cross Entry: Riders competing in the Children's Hunter Pony section are not limited to the number of ponies they may show, providing they are not also competing in the Green or Regular Hunter Pony sections and/or Children's Hunter Horse section at the same competition (Exception: competitions which limit entries in accordance with GR 915). If a rider competing in the Children's Hunter Pony section chooses to compete in sections other than Children's Hunter Pony at the same competition, these riders are limited to competing a maximum of one (1) different pony in the Green or Regular Pony Hunter section and one (1) horse in the Children's Hunter horse section at the same competition and in any class not to exceed 3'5" (Exception: Pony Jumpers).

Judging: To be judged on performance and soundness, suitability to count.

Height of Fences: Small/Medium: 2'0" and Large: 2'6"

Combining/Dividing Sections: Classes may be run as one or split Small/Medium and Large. Suggested Distances: At management's discretion, Children's Hunter Pony may choose to run the section as follows using the suggested distance guidelines:

a. 2' Small Children's Hunter Pony should be (based on 9'9" stride): 4 strides at 48'9"; 5 strides at 58'6"; 6 strides at 68'3"; 7 strides at 78'8"; 8 strides at 87'9".

b. 2'3" Medium Children's Hunter Pony should be (based on a 10'3" stride): 4 strides at 51'3"; 5 strides at 61'6"; 6 strides at 71'9"; 7 strides at 82'; 8 strides at 92'3".

c. 2'6" Large Children's Hunter Pony should be (based on an 11' stride): 4 strides at 55'; 5 strides at 66'; 6 strides at 77'; 7 strides at 88'; 8 strides at 99'.

Jog: Horses and Ponies may be jogged at the horse show management's discretion.

Awards: Zone Horse of the Year Awards will be presented annually the Children's Hunter Pony Small/Medium section and the Children's Hunter Pony-Large section.

PRE-GREEN - Refer to HU106.3.

Awards: Zone Horse of the Year Awards will be presented annually to the Pre-Green 3' section and the Pre-Green 3'3 section.

AGE GROUP EQUITATION

Equitation 14 & Under, Equitation 15-17 - Refer to GR1131.11

Adult Equitation 18-35, Adult Equitation 36 & Over - Refer to GR1131.11



2015 Guidelines For Combining and Dividing Hunter Sections



Amateur Owner 3'6" [HU115.1]

- National and Premier competitions must offer two sections: A/O 18-35 (or floating split) and A/O 36+ (or floating split)
- If there are fewer than six entries in either age section, then they must be combined
- If there are at least six in each age section, then both age sections must be held separately
- If there are a minimum of 12 entries when sections are combined, the newly combined section must be re-divided using a floating or California Split (see HU112)
- If both age sections are combined and there are fewer than three (3) total [HU115.1c]:
 - (1) the combined A/O 3'6" section may be canceled at Management's discretion [HU161]; or (2) the combined A/O 3'6" section may be further combined with Amateur Owner 3'3" and/or a completely combined Junior Hunter section, at Management's discretion [HU115.1c]
- Amateur Owner 3'6" must have both age groups combined in one section before combining with the Amateur Owner 3'3" or Junior Hunter sections.

Amateur Owner 3'3" [HU115.2]

- National and Premier competitions must offer two sections: A/O 18-35 (or floating split) and A/O 36+ (or floating split)
- If there are fewer than six entries in either age section, then they must be combined
- If there are at least six in each section, then they must be held separately
- If there are a minimum of 12 entries when sections are combined, the newly combined section must be re-divided using a floating or California Split (see HU112)
- If both age sections are combined and there are fewer than three (3) total [HU115.1c]:
 - (1) the combined A/O 3'3" section may be canceled at Management's discretion [HU161]; or (2) the combined A/O 3'3" section may be further combined with Amateur Owner 3'6" and/or a completely combined Junior Hunter section, at Management's discretion [HU115.1c]
- Amateur Owner 3'3" must have both age groups combined in one section before combining with the Junior Hunter or Amateur Owner 3'6" sections. [HU115.1c]

Junior Hunter 3'6" [HU111]

- Must offer four sections at Premier competitions (large/younger, large/older, small/younger, small/older)
- Must offer two sections at National competitions (large and small) [HU118]
- If there are fewer than six entries in any sections divided by height and/or age then those sections must be combined
- Example: if there are fewer than six in one Junior Hunter section, but there are six or more in all the other Junior Hunter sections, then the one section with fewer than six would be combined with one of the other Junior Hunter sections
- If there are at least six in each divided section, the sections must be held separately
- If all the junior hunter sections have been combined into one section and there are fewer than three (3) total: (1) the combined Junior Hunter section may be canceled at Management's discretion [HU161]; or (2) the combined Junior Hunter section may be further combined with the Junior Hunter 3'3", Amateur Owner 3'6", or Amateur Owner 3'3" section, at Management's discretion [HU111.8]
- Junior Hunter 3'6" sections must have all height/age groups combined into one section before combining with Junior Hunter 3'3", Amateur Owner 3'6" or Amateur Owner 3'3"
- If there are a minimum of 12 entries when sections are combined, the newly combined section must be split using one of the following options (Children's Hunter sections must be split in accordance with applicable Zone Specifications):
 - By age of rider (age must be given on entry blank, 15 and under & 16-17);
 - By height of horse;
 - Floating Split (See HU112 for definition of Floating Split.);
 - California Split (See HU112 for definition of California Split.)

Junior Hunter 3'3" [HU111]

- Junior Hunter 3'3" may be offered as one section or may be offered divided by size of horse and/or age of rider.
- If there are fewer than six entries in any sections divided by height and/or age then those sections must be combined
- If there are fewer than three (3) total in Junior Hunter 3'3", the section may be canceled at Management's discretion [HU161]; or the section may be further combined with a completely combined section of Junior Hunter 3'6", Amateur Owner 3'6" or Amateur Owner 3'3", at Management's discretion [HU111.8]
- If there are a minimum of 12 entries when sections are combined, the newly combined section must be split using one of the following options (Children's Hunter sections must be split in accordance with applicable Zone Specifications):
 - By age of rider (age must be given on entry blank, 15 and under & 16-17);
 - By height of horse;

- Floating Split (See HU112 for definition of Floating Split.);
- California Split (See HU112 for definition of California Split.)

Children's Hunter [HU111.13]

- Children's Hunter sections may be combined in accordance with 2015 Zone Specifications.
- If rules for combining sections are not included in Zone Specifications then the following applies:
- If there are fewer than six entries in any divided section, the sections must be combined. If there are six or more entries in each divided section, the divided sections must be held separately.

Adult Amateur [HU115.3]

- Adult Amateur Hunter sections may be combined in accordance with 2015 Zone Specifications.
- If rules for combining sections are not included in Zone Specifications then the following applies:
- If there are fewer than six entries in any divided section, the sections must be combined. If there are six or more entries in each divided section, the divided sections must be held separately.

Regular Pony Hunter [HU116.3]

- National and Premier competitions must offer three height sections (small, medium, large)
- Sections may be combined if there are three (3) or fewer entries in any height section
- Sections must be held separately if there are four (4) or more entries in each height section See HU116.4 for B and C rated sections

Green Hunter Pony [HU116.3]

- National and Premier competitions must offer a minimum of two sections (small/medium and large) but may offer three sections
- Sections may be combined if there are three or fewer entries in any height section
- Sections must be split into small, medium and large if there are four or more entries in any height section. See HU116.4 for B and C rated sections

High Performance Hunter [HU112.11]

- The High Performance section must be combined with the 2nd Year Green Hunter section if there are fewer than three entries in the High Performance section
- If a combined section of High Performance and 2nd Year Green has less than three entries, then it must be combined with 1st Year Green
- If there were different amounts of prize money or entry fees for the original sections, the new combined section will use the lower amount for entry fees and prize money
- When High Performance Working Hunter is combined with a Green Hunter section then a section entry fee will be required and individual classes of High Performance Hunter cannot be entered.

Green Working Hunter

- Must be divided if there are at least six 1st Year Green horses and six 2nd Year Green horses [HU113]
- When 1st Year Green and 2nd Year Green sections are combined, and the combined Green Working section has fewer than three entries, then it must be further combined with the High Performance Working Hunter Section [HU112.11]

Regular Conformation Hunter / Green Conformation Hunter [HU114]

- The Green and Regular Conformation sections must be offered separately at Premier competitions
- The sections must be combined when there are three or fewer horses in either section
- The sections must be divided if there are four or more horses in each Conformation section

Performance Working Hunter 3'6" / Performance Working Hunter 3'3" [HU112.7]

- Performance 3'6" and Performance 3'3" must be combined if there are fewer than six entries in either section, but they cannot be combined with any other hunter sections
- The sections must be held separately if there are six or more in each Performance Hunter section
- 3'3" and 3'6" Performance Hunter sections cannot be combined with High Performance Hunter
- Pre-Green Hunter [HU106.3]**
- Competitions may divide the 3' and 3'3" height sections of Pre-Green or offer one
- Classes may be divided or combined at competition management's discretion

\$5,000 USHJA NATIONAL HUNTER DERBY

Entry Fee: \$375 (includes \$25 fee to USHJA)

Participation: Open to horses and riders who are members in good standing with the USEF and the USHJA. Foreign residents and horses in good standing with their national federations are eligible to compete; however points will not count unless they are also members of the USEF and USHJA. Horses competing must have competed in (2) additional classes at the same show.

The number of horses a rider can compete is not limited. The same horse may not compete in the USHJA National Hunter Derby and the USHJA International Hunter Derby at the same competition.

During the two rounds of the National Hunter Derby, all horses entered must be ridden in official horse show schooling areas unless Management designates a specific schooling area for National Hunter Derby horses. Riders must wear their horse's Derby competition number while mounted. This includes horses entered simultaneously in another class, if any. Entered horses ridden or schooled elsewhere on the competition grounds or NOT wearing their Derby competition number will be eliminated from competing in the Derby and the entry fee will be forfeited.

Jog: Horses will not be jogged for soundness. Any unsoundness during the competition will be reflected in the judges scores.

Start Order: The order will be posted before one hour prior to the start of the class. In the first round all the horses' names are drawn individually starting with the first position and then working down. In the case of riders with more than one horse management will pre-select the draw positions making every effort to have at least eight horses between rides. In the second round the order will be the reverse of the First Round scores (lowest to highest).

Attire: Buff breeches and shad belly or white breeches and dark or scarlet coat, hunt colors coat or official sponsor or team jacket.

First Round: The first round shall be judged on performance, hunter pace, jumping style, quality and substance, and movement. After the judges base score is given, one point will be added for each high option fence jumped. The Option Bonus Score of one additional point must be awarded even if there is a refusal, rail down or loss of good jumping style at that higher height option fence, providing that the horse-and-rider combination does jump the higher height option fence. (Maximum of four points.)

Fences: 3' with four option fences set at 3'5".

Classic Hunter Style Course (First Round) 1. A minimum of ten obstacles must be offered in the Classic Hunter Round. 2. At least one in and out 3. At least one bending line 4. At least one line with an unrelated distance 5. At least one long approach

Second Round: The second round shall be judged on performance, hunter pace, jumping style, quality and substance, movement, handiness and brilliance of pace. Handiness is defined as ground saving movement without adversely affecting performance or style. Brilliance of pace is defined as a faster pace than ordinary, without sacrificing performance or style. Handiness is taken into account in the judges' base score. After the judges' base score is given, one point will be added for each high option fence jumped. The Option Bonus Score of one additional point must be awarded even if there is a refusal, rail down or loss of good jumping style at that higher height option fence, providing that the horse-and-rider combination does jump the higher height option fence. (Maximum of four points.)

Handy Hunter Course (Second Round) 1. A minimum of eight obstacles must be offered in the Handy Hunter Round. 2. The course should simulate riding over hunt country and must have a minimum of two handy options, such as: tight turns, different tracks, clever options for jump approaches, pen type obstacles, hand gallop a jump, trot a lowered obstacle not to exceed 2'6" in height, halt and/or back. Gimmicky options are not appropriate. 3. Unless the prize list states that more than 12 entries are to return for the second round, then only the top 12 horses from the first round, after all ties are broken, are eligible to return for the second round.

Overall Score: The final score from each round will be either averaged or added as specified in the prize list to obtain the overall total for each horse.

Ties: A. Neither judging panel may award the same base score to any two competitors in any one round unless a competitor's score is below the cut-off score. B. All ties in all rounds will be broken by the base score (before adding height bonus points) of that round. C. Unless the prize list states that more than 12 entries are to return for the second round, only the top 12 horses from the first round, after all ties are broken, are eligible to return for the second round. D. All ties for overall first place in the class will compete in a jump-off round. In the case of unsafe conditions preventing a jump-off from being held, the tie will be broken using the second round base score (before adding height bonus points). E. Ties for other than first place in the overall standings will be broken using the second round base score (before adding height bonus points).

Awards: Judges are required to pin to 12th place (plus two reserve placings) for the purpose of awarding zone bonus points. All riders in the top eight overall (or their designated representative if not available) must ride for ribbons in order to receive prize money.

Participation: In order for International Hunter Derby points to be awarded, riders must complete the USHJA Exhibitor Declaration Form. If the Exhibitor Declaration Form is not completed and submitted to the show office either at the time of entry or by 5 p.m. the day before the class, riders will not receive points for the International Hunter Derby. Riders may only declare hunter sections for National HOTY points.

There is no limit to the number of horses a rider can ride in each class.

Horses entered in this class are not required to show in any other hunter or jumper classes at the horse show. Horses entered in this class may not cross enter into the USHJA National Hunter Derby at the same competition.

Meetings/Draw: Riders Meeting will be held prior to the start of the class. Course designer and at least one officiating Judge and Steward must attend this meeting to answer any questions regarding the course, judging system and class specifications.

Attire: Formal/dress attire required by riders. Buff breeches and shad belly, white breeches and dark or scarlet coat, hunt colors coat or official sponsor or team jacket permitted.

Official 24-Hour Check In

A. All horses entered in the International Hunter Derby class must check-in 24 hours prior to the start of the first round in order to compete. The Official Check-In must be held 24 hours prior to the start of the first round. B. A horse must be officially entered in the class before it will be allowed to check-in. C. The Official Check-In shall be conducted by the competition steward. Management may choose the method in which the Official Check-In is conducted. Each horse's back number and stall number must be provided to the steward regardless of the method of check-in.

All horses will be monitored and must remain on the competition grounds until the horse is finished competing in the Derby class. Any horse that leaves the premises prior to completing it's participation in the Derby class is disqualified. All horses must be ridden in official horse show schooling areas unless Management designates a specific schooling area for Derby horses. Riders must wear the horses' competition number while mounted.

Order of Go: A. The order of go will be posted a minimum of one hour prior to the start of the class. B. The draw may be performed by hand or competition management may host a computer draw.

C. In the case of multiple horses being ridden by the same rider, every effort will be made so that there will be a minimum of eight horses (if available) separating multiple rides. All horses must be ridden in the sequence that appears on the jumping order in the first round of the competition. In the second round horses will return in reverse order of their first round scores (lowest to highest). Due to multiple rides or rider conflicts, any rider may elect to move up in the order. Should a jump-off occur, horses will return in the same order in which they competed in the second round.

104 Classic Hunter Style Round (First Round) - shall be judged and numerically scored on quality, movement, jumping style, manners and way of going. Pace and brilliance are to be rewarded. In addition to this base score, each judging panel must award an Option Bonus Score consisting of one additional point for every higher height option fence jumped. These two scores must be announced separately and then added together to determine each horse-and-rider combination's score for this round from each judging panel. The scores of all the judging panels will be added together to determine the total score of each horse-and-rider combination for this round.

1. A minimum of 10 obstacles must be offered in the Classic Hunter Style Round. 2. Fences must be set at 3'6" to 4'0" in height, exception option fences. No more than 50% of the course may be set at 3'6" in height. 3. The course must include four higher height option fences set at a minimum of 4'3" in height (no maximum height). If there is a difference in difficulty between any two tracks containing height options, the higher options should include the more inviting obstacles and be on the less difficult track. The number of higher height option fences cannot exceed four and the jump cups on those fences must be normal deep cups of 25 - 30 mm. 4. At least one in and out. 5. At least one bending line. 6. At least one line with an unrelated distance. 7. At least one fence with a long approach.

105 Handy Hunter Round (Second Round) - shall be judged and numerically scored on quality, movement, jumping style, manners and way of going. Pace and brilliance are to be rewarded. Jumping decorations to utilize a shorter track is NOT permissible. In addition to this base score, each judging panel must award an Option Bonus Score consisting of one additional point for every higher height option fence jumped and each judging panel must award a Handy Bonus Score consisting of between zero and 10 bonus points to each horse-and-rider combination for handiness of round. These three scores must be announced separately and then added together to determine each horse-and-rider combination's score for this round from each judging panel. The scores of all the judging panels will be added together to determine the total score of each horse-and-rider combination for this round.

1. A minimum of eight obstacles must be offered in the Handy Hunter Round. 2. Fences must be set at 3'6" to 4'0" in height, exception option fences. No more than 50% of the course may be set at 3'6" in height. 3. The course must include four higher height option fences set at a minimum of 4'3" in height (no maximum height). Unless the prize list states that more than 12 entries are to return for the second round, then only the top 12 horses from the first round, after all ties are broken, are eligible to return for the second round.

Jump-Off: (If required) - shall be judged and numerically scored on quality, movement, jumping style, manners and way of going. Pace and brilliance are to be rewarded. Jumping decorations to utilize a shorter track is NOT permissible. In addition to this base score, each judging panel must award an Option Bonus Score consisting of one additional point for every higher height option fence jumped and each judging panel must award a Handy Bonus Score consisting of between zero and 10 bonus points to each horse-and-rider combination for handiness of round. These three scores must be announced separately and then added together to determine each horse-and-rider combination's score for this round from each judging panel. The scores of all the judging panels will be added together to determine the total score of each horse-and-rider combination for this round.

Overall: The total scores of each horse-and-rider combination from each round will be added together to determine their final overall Hunter Derby score. This score will determine the final overall standings for the class.

Awards: USHJA ribbons will be awarded for Round One 103 and Round Two 104 and for the Overall Placings 102. All riders (or their designated representative if not available) in the Top 12 must ride for ribbons in order to receive prize money.

Hunter Over Fences: To be shown over approximately eight fences at the required height. To be judged on performance and soundness unless otherwise noted.

Hunter Under Saddle: To be shown at a walk, trot and canter. Light contact with the horse's mouth is required. May be asked to hand gallop at the discretion of the judge but no more than eight to gallop at one time. Green and non-rated hunters sections will not be asked to gallop.

Model Classes: To be shown at a walk and trot on the line; to be judged on conformation, way of moving and soundness.

Hunter Champion and Reserve Champion: To be awarded to two of the four horses scoring the most points over fences, in addition, only these horses will receive full points for ribbons won under saddle and half points for ribbons won in the model. Full points for Regular Conformation Model.

Hunter sections may be run as back-to-back classes at management's discretion (USEF HU155). When classes are run back-to-back, exhibitors may perform both rounds before leaving the ring. All classes will be judged on performance and soundness unless otherwise indicated.

Starting orders will be produced and run in accordance with USEF HU156.

Courses will simulate fences found in the hunting field such as: brush, wall, in and out, oxer, post and rails, gate, aiken, bank, coop and panels. Management reserves the right to adjust fence heights or spreads as competition warrants.

All hunter divisions will be held in accordance with USEF rules and Zone 5 Specifications where noted.

Hunter sections may be combined or split as stipulated by the USEF rules.

Individual hunter classes may be entered for 20% of the prize money offered in that class unless otherwise specified in accordance with USEF HU 159.

PRE-GREEN HUNTER

A Pre-Green Hunter is a horse of any age in its first or second year of showing over 3' to 3'3" fences at USEF Regular Member or Canadian Equestrian Federation or any national or international competition. Fences not to exceed 3'3". A 3' section must be offered and a 3'3" section may be offered. Horses may only compete in one height section at a show but may alternate from one show to another. Once a horse has shown 3'6" he is not eligible to compete in the Pre-Green Hunter division, regardless of age. (USEF HU106.3)

Class routine:

The over fences phase will be held first. It is to consist of a course of 8 or more jumps with or without wings. Two or more tests will be incorporated in the course. The judge, course designer and Medal Finals Committee will design this jumping phase. IT SHOULD BE DESIGNED TO BEFIT A MEDAL FINAL PERFORMANCE. Riders will compete based on a random order of go.

The flat phase will consist of a walk, trot and canter plus at least two or more tests from the USEF Equitation rules.

Scoring: After both phases, the rider's flat phase score and over fences phase score will both be announced. The two scores from all contestants will be added together, and final placings announced. The same animal must be shown in both phases of the finals in the same tack in which such animal began the finals EXCEPT NO MARTINGALES ON THE FLAT.

Winner may show again the following year(s) if qualified..

ELECTRICAL REQUIREMENTS FOR SAFETY OF PEOPLE & ANIMALS ON SITE DURING SHOW

1. All electrical cords should be 12 gauge heavy duty or 14 gauge heavy duty. These cords must be 3 wire grounded cords. No 2 wire cords will be allowed.
2. Power strips or cord splitters are allowed but must be heavy duty and be 3 wire grounded type and U.L. rated at 15 amps or more. No lamp cords or indoor rated only cords or power strips will be allowed on site.
3. Power supplied to the stalls is for the use of fans for horses, not for refrigerators or other such items. If you are in need of power for a refrigerator for medical supplies for your animals please let the horse show know in advance as there may be a small charge included in this requirement.
4. RV outlets are 30 amp plugs and will be located at the rear of the parking spots. Please be sure you have enough cord, and an adaptor to 30 amps if your RV requires one.
5. These requirements are for your safety and the safety of your animals. We have upgraded all power systems on site in order to insure safety on site. An electrical contractor will be on site during the show to insure that rules are enforced and to help everyone stay in compliance with the rules.
6. If you have any concerns or questions the onsite contractor can be reached. This is a service to answer any questions you may have regarding the requirements for the horse show.
7. Fans for stalls must be ul listed fans. These can be 2 wire cord connected if made by the manufacturer. Fans used in tents or barns for horse cooling will be checked by the electrician on site to make sure they are in safe working order.
8. There will be a small supply of cords on site to help keep everyone in compliance I urge you to check all your cords and equipment in advance prior to the show.
9. I will do all in my power to help everyone stay safe and have a great show. Please feel free to contact me with any questions or concerns. And as a reminder check your cords and fans at home to make sure all is well.

LIFE, SENIOR ACTIVE, AND JUNIOR ACTIVE MEMBERS SHALL BE ELIGIBLE TO PARTICIPATE IN ALL CLASSES AT REGULAR COMPETITIONS, EVENTING COMPETITIONS AT THE PRELIMINARY LEVEL OR ABOVE, AND COMBINED DRIVING COMPETITIONS AT THE ADVANCED LEVEL, DRESSAGE, REINING AND VAULTING COMPETITIONS AND ENDURANCE RIDES. A NON-MEMBER MAY PARTICIPATE AS A HANDLER, RIDER, DRIVER, OWNER, LESSEE, AGENT, COACH OR TRAINER AT REGULAR COMPETITIONS, EVENTING COMPETITIONS, DRESSAGE COMPETITIONS, REINING COMPETITIONS AND COMBINED DRIVING COMPETITIONS UPON PAYMENT OF A \$30 SHOW PASS. PARTICIPANTS IN THE FOLLOWING CLASSES ARE EXEMPTED FROM THE REQUIREMENTS OF THIS RULE: 1) LEADLINE; 2) EXHIBITIONS; 3) GAMES AND RACES; 4) CLASSES FOR 4-H MEMBERS; 5) WALK-TROT AND ACADEMY CLASSES (ACADEMY CLASSES ARE CLASSES LIMITED TO HORSES USED REGULARLY IN A LESSON PROGRAM); 6) USDF INTRODUCTORY LEVEL TESTS, PAS DE DEUX AND QUADRILLE CLASSES; 7) NRHA ENDORSED REINING COMPETITIONS 8.) OPPORTUNITY CLASSES, 9.) CITIZENS OF OTHER NATIONS WHO HAVE PROOF, IN ENGLISH, OF CURRENT MEMBERSHIP IN GOOD STANDING OF THEIR OWN NATIONAL FEDERATION 10.) USEA BEGINNER NOVICE DIVISION, 11) ASSISTANT HANDLERS IN DRESSAGE SPORT HORSE BREEDING CLASSES.

Federation Entry Agreement GR906.4 - By entering a Federation-licensed Competition and signing this entry blank as the Owner, Lessee, Trainer, Manager, Agent, Coach, Driver, Rider, Handler, Vaultor or Longeur and on behalf of myself and my principals, representatives, employees and agents, I agree that I am subject to the Bylaws and Rules of The United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. (the "Federation") and the local rules of the competition.

I agree to be bound by the Bylaws and Rules of the Federation and the competition. I will accept as final the decision of the Hearing Committee on any question arising under the Rules, and agree to release and hold harmless the competition, the Federation, their officials, directors, and employees for any action taken under the Rules.

I represent that I am eligible to enter and/or participate under the Rules, and every horse I am entering is eligible as entered.

I also agree that as a condition of and in consideration of acceptance of entry, the Federation and/or the Competition may use or assign photographs, videos, audios, cablecasts, broadcasts, internet, film, new media or other likenesses of me and my horse taken during the course of the competition for the promotion, coverage or benefit of the competition, sport or the Federation. Those likenesses shall not be used to advertise a product and they may not be used in such a way as to jeopardize amateur status. I hereby expressly and irrevocably waive and release any rights in connection with such use, including any claim to compensation, invasion of privacy, right to publicity, or to misappropriation.

The construction and application of Federation rules are governed by the laws of the State of New York, and any action instituted against the Federation must be filed in New York State. See GR908.4.

Horse Recordings GR1102 - The Federation maintains the only official record of winnings of horses at all Regular Competitions. To keep these records consistent, a horse should be recorded with the Federation in the same name of horse and owner under which it is exhibited at competitions. The Federation's horse recording records are not a title registry and the Federation does not decide, otherwise resolve, or become involved in ownership disputes.

2. Closing Date: July 22, 2015

TPHCHS requires that processing fee, stabling fee or grounds fee, and USEF Drug & Administration fee or other fees accompany each entry blank. Entries will be processed only when accompanied by payment of the above fees. Make all checks payable to Traders Point Hunt Charity Horse Show, in United States Funds. Entry blanks must be signed by the owner or his authorized agent, trainer, riders, and/or coach. Acknowledgments will not be mailed. Stalls fees are not refundable after the closing date.

3. Entries and Nominations:

- a) Entries close according to the above schedule. Entries will be accepted the day of the class at management's discretion. A post entry charge of \$50 per class will apply.
- b) Nominations for all Jumper Sections and classes close according to the above schedule or as otherwise noted. Post nominations will be accepted after the closing date at the regular nominating fee plus a late charge of \$25 unless otherwise stated.
- c) Declarations to show horses which have been nominated for the Jumper Division must be made during Competition Office hours (See Rule No. 16) and received by the Competition Secretary no later than 5:00 p.m. the day before the class is held unless otherwise noted. At management's discretion entries received after 5:00 pm may be accepted and a late fee of \$50 per class will be assessed for all classes other than Grand Prix and Classic declarations.
- d) Late or improper Grand Prix & Classic declarations: Declarations received after the published deadline or declarations improperly completed will be accepted at management's discretion. A penalty of \$100 per \$10,000 class or less; \$150 per \$25,000 - \$100,000 class will be assessed without exception.

In the event of acceptance of a late declaration where a Starting Order is established, the declared entrant will be placed prior to the #1 position in the Starting Order.
- e) Horses competing in classes that they have not been entered will be required to pay a double entry fee in those classes.
- f) Each entry form must give the USEF/USHJA membership numbers; owner, rider, trainer and horse. A proper mailing address; telephone numbers and either a Social Security Number or Federal ID Number for each prize money recipient must be given.
- g) The owner as listed on the entry form will be responsible for all entry fees, nomination fees, and stabling fees of all horses entered or nominated on the entry form.
- h) A fine of \$50 plus collection fees will be made for all non-negotiable checks. Foreign competitors, please pay in U.S. funds to avoid discount charges.

4. Scratches/Refunds:

- a) Horses entered in hunter sections, classes or equitation classes must be scratched by written notice and presented or sent to the Competition Secretary. A Veterinarian Certificate is not required. This written notice must be in the possession of the Secretary one hour prior to the start of the hunter section/class to be scratched. When valid notice of a scratch is received, the entry fee will be credited less a \$25 per class office processing fee.

Once a hunter section has started, horses that are not competing in classes in which they are entered will forfeit their fees unless the horse becomes ill or injured prior to the class or classes in which it is entered. In this case, in order to qualify for a credit, a scratch sheet must be filled out and presented to the Secretary. In addition, an Official Veterinarian Certificate must be filled out and signed by the Official Competition Veterinarian, certifying the illness or injury, and presented to the Secretary no later than one hour after the final class of the competition. Entry fees will then be credited less the processing fee of \$75 per horse.
- b) In all jumper classes in which a declaration to compete is made, once the class has started, the entry fee as stated in the Prize List will be charged whether the horse is shown or not. In order to scratch a horse from classes declared, an official form (scratch sheet) must be filled out and presented to the Secretary before the start of the class being scratched. Upon timely receipt of the scratch form, the entry fee will be credited.
- c) \$100 of the nomination fee will be refunded to the owners of horses that have been scratched (scratch sheet) twenty-four hours prior to the start of the competition. If the horse is scratched within 24 hours to the start of the competition, an Official Veterinarian Certificate filled out and signed by the Official Competition Veterinarian and must be presented to the Secretary prior to the conclusion of the last class of the competition in order to obtain this refund. If a horse is scratched after competing in any class at the competition, no refund of the nominating fee will be given.
- d) Full refunds will be given before the closing date of entries. Stalls are not re-

fundable after the closing date. Refunds will be mailed 30 days after the conclusion of the show.

5. Stabling:

- a) Horses and equipment will be admitted to Wild Air Farm from Sunday, August 4 between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 6:00 p.m. Anyone wishing to arrive prior to the above dates or at some other hour must make special arrangements. (941) 744-5465 prior to 7/30 -- (317) 873-5552 after 8/1.

- b) Initial bedding will not be provided unless otherwise stated.
- c) Unless special arrangements are made with Management, stalls must be vacated no later than 12:00 noon the day following the conclusion of the show.
- d) \$35 ship in fee per horse per day will be charged to horses entered but not stabled on the grounds. A designated area will be set aside for day exhibitors.

NO STALL FEES REFUNDS AFTER THE CLOSING DATE.

6. Competition Office Hours:

Competition days - Opens one hour before the start of the first class and closes one hour following the last class or 5:00 pm whichever is later. Non Competition Days: 9:00 am - 5:00 pm.

- 7. Account Settlement:** All accounts must be settled in full no later than 5:00 pm on the last day of the show.
- 8. Feed and Bedding** Feed and Bedding may be pre-ordered by emailing info@stadiumjumping.com or by calling (317) 873-5552 after 8/1. All orders will be charged to your show account. Large barns please make note of all customers to be charged on each feed and bedding order. Form enclosed in this prize list.
- 9. Campers:** Camper spaces will be available starting Sunday, August 2nd. Camper fee is \$321 for the week and include one 30 or 50(limited) amp camper outlet and water hook-up. Form enclosed in this prize list.
- 10. Paddocks:** A limited number of paddocks are available for \$850 starting Sunday, August 2 through Sunday, August 9. This is a first come first serve basis. TPHCHS will not be responsible or liable for leased paddocks. It is recommended that you bring a padlock for the gate.

11. Prize money:

- a) Prize money will be credited to the entry's show account after the results of the class winnings are posted or a check will be mailed to the Prize Money recipient at the address on the entry blank within thirty days after the show, thereby ending the show's responsibility as long as all criteria has been met. Exhibitors must provide a social security number or Federal TIN for the prize money recipient. If a prize money recipient is not denoted the prize money will automatically go to the owner. Any excess prize money will be mailed to the prize money recipient.
- b) Prize Money Won by Foreign Competitors: Be advised that the U.S. Internal Revenue Service requires sporting events to withhold 30% of prize money won in the United States. Foreign competitors should apply for a U.S. Social Security number and will be asked to complete form 8283 or complete a W-8 Certificate of Foreign Status form.
- c) Lost or stolen prize money checks will be reissued only after a 180 day waiting period from the original check date has passed. In the event of unauthorized re-depositing of a check, TPHCHS will provide check copies to exhibitors and will be held harmless from the collection process.
- 12. Food Service:** Available on the show grounds beginning Tuesday through Sunday.
- 13. Hunter Scoring:** The open numerical hunter scoring system may be used at the discretion of Management.
- 14. Courtesy Circle:** Management reserves the right to limit the Courtesy Circle in Hunter and Equitation classes.
- 15. Hors Concours:** No horses or ponies will be allowed in any jumper, hunter or equitation class 'hors concours' during the competition.
- 16. Competition Ring Access:** Horses will not be allowed in the competition rings for schooling before competition hours with the exception of warm-up days. Hand walking of horses may be permitted at management's discretion.
- 18. Numbers:** Competitors competing without a number or with an incorrect number may be refused an award at Management's discretion.

19. Attire: Please read USEF GR801

- a) Appropriate dress is required in all classes:
- b) Formal attire: Jumpers - As required by USEF and FEI rules.
- c) Formal attire: Hunter - As required by USEF HU127.
- d) Jumper riders may wear breeches and solid colored polo shirts unless otherwise noted in the prize list.
- e) Protective Headgear & Dress: GR 801 1. It is the tradition of the competition ring that riders and drivers be correctly attired for the class in question, that attendants be neatly dressed and horses be properly presented. 2. It is compulsory for all persons at Federation licensed hunter, jumper or hunter/jumper competitions when mounted anywhere on the competition grounds, to wear properly fastened protective headgear which meets or exceeds ASTM (American Society for Testing and Materials)/SEI (Safety Equipment Institute) standards for equestrian use and carries the SEI tag. It must be properly fitted with harness secured. Exception: In hunter or jumper classes, adults may be allowed to remove their headgear while accepting prizes and during the playing of the National Anthem only; they must refasten their headgear prior to the lap of honor.

For all exhibitors competing in the hunter or hunter seat equitation section, if a rider's chin strap becomes unfastened, the rider may stop, re-fasten the chin strap and continue his/her round without penalty or elimination. A judge may, but is not required to stop a rider and ask them to refasten a chin strap which has become unfastened, again without penalty to the rider. Members of the Armed Services or the Police may wear the Service Dress Uniform.

Any exhibitor may wear protective headgear (ASTM/SEI) and/or a protective safetyvest, specifically designed for use in equestrian sport in any division or class without penalty from the judge. The Federation recommends that the vest meet or surpass the current ASTM standard or be certified by the Safety Equipment Institute.

Except as may otherwise be mandated by local law, the Federation strongly encourages all riders, while riding anywhere on the competition grounds, to wear protective headgear with harness secured which passes or surpasses ASTM (American Society for Testing and Materials)/SEI (Safety Equipment Institute) standards for equestrian use and carries the SEI tag. (Exception hunter, jumper, or hunter/ jumper competitions refer to GR801.2) It is the responsibility of the rider, or the parent or guardian or trainer of the junior exhibitor to see to it that the headgear worn complies with appropriate safety standards for protective headgear intended for equestrian use, and is properly fitted and in good condition, and the Federation, Show Committee, and Licensed Officials are not responsible for checking headgear worn for such compliance. 8

The Federation makes no representation or warranty, express or implied, about any protective headgear, and cautions riders that death or serious injury may result despite wearing such headgear as all equestrian sports involve inherent dangerous risk and as no helmet can protect against all foreseeable injuries.

Boots/shoes worn while riding anywhere on the competition grounds must have a distinguishable heel. (

Competitors must display the correct number which must be clearly visible while performing in any class unless otherwise stated in the prize list. Competitors may be penalized at the discretion of the judge. Numbers to be supplied by management in compliance with GR1213.11. Refer to EQ109.1 and HU127.

- f. No mounted exhibitor may wear or carry an electronic communication device (i.e., cellular telephone, pager, walkie talkie, etc.) while in the competition ring. The penalty for wearing or carrying a forbidden device if observed by the judge is elimination from the class during which the device was worn or carried. Exception: A handicapped participant may use electronic devices if, prior to the class, he/she presents to the USEF Steward written justification from treating personnel setting forth the necessity of the equipment.
- 20. Award Ceremonies:** Riders are required to ride for awards in all Classic/Grand Prix and Derby competitions, unless notice of ceremony cancellation has been given. Failure of a rider to be present will result in forfeiture of all prizes won in the class.
- 21. Orders of Go:** Produced in accordance with Federation Rules JP 112 and HU 156. Riders and trainers who have conflicts due to classes in more than one ring at the same time should see the Starter or Technical Coordinator so that necessary adjustments can be made. At no time will any ring be held up over 3 minutes due to conflicts.
- 22. Schooling:** All schooling shall be held under the inspection of the

Steward/Schooling Supervisor in the designated schooling areas. Designated schooling areas and schooling hours will be posted in the Competition Office. Lunging will be permitted in designated area's only.

23. **Courses:** In all jumper classes, courses may consist of any combination of the following: brush, gates, oxers, rails, planks, water, liverpool, ditch, wall and panels. In all hunter classes, fences will simulate fences found in the hunting field such as: brush, wall, in-and-out, oxer, post and rails, gate, aiken, bank and panels.

24. **Vehicles & Designated Parking:**

Fire regulations prohibit all vehicles, including trailers, vans and campers, from being parked in the stable areas. Exception: loading and unloading periods. PARKING AREAS WILL BE DESIGNATED AND VIOLATORS WILL BE TOWED AT THEIR EXPENSE.

Indiana State Law: Any motorized vehicles (electric or gasoline) on the competition grounds must be operated by persons with a valid drivers license.

GR1301.7: Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles, on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. The parent(s), legal guardian(s), or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from that operation. Violations of this rule will be cause for sanctions against the parent(s), guardian(s) and/or trainer(s) who are responsible for the child committing the offense. Penalties may include exclusion of the child, parent(s), guardian(s), and/or trainer(s) from the competition grounds for the remainder of the competition and charges being filed against any of the above individuals in accordance with Chapter 6. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

25. **Dogs:** All dogs must be leashed at all times while on the show grounds. Loose dogs will be picked up and detained until the owner has paid a \$100 fine to be donated to the Riley Foundation. For a second offense, the owner may be barred from competing and required to leave the grounds. We find this extreme action necessary in order to protect exhibitors from injury and to protect their financial investment. This rule will be strictly enforced.

26. **Health Certificates:** Indiana regulations require that all equines be covered by official interstate health certificates, issued by a licensed veterinarian, showing that the animals are free from any symptoms of any infectious or communicable disease. The certificate shall include the name of the owner and address, destination in Indiana, number of horses examined, the name, registration number(s), if any, tattoo, if any, sex, age, rectal temperature, color, and markings of each animal listed. Health certificates will become void after 30 days from issue. Health certificates must show animals to be negative to an equine infectious anemia test within the past 12 months. Date of test and approved laboratory must be shown on health certificate. Equine Rhinopneumonitis vaccination is not required; however, if any animal is vaccinated, it is ineligible for entry within 21 days of vaccination. Vehicles transporting animals must have certificates showing that it was cleaned and disinfected under veterinary supervision prior to loading. This information can be written on the health certificate.

27. **Medical Waste:** In accordance with the 1989 Federal Waste Tracking Act which restricts the disposal of medical waste, Bio Hazardous Medical Waste Containers will be provided in the stable area. All Exhibitors and their agents are responsible for the proper disposal of this waste.

28. **Liability:**

- a) Traders Point Hunt Charity Horse Show their officials, sponsors and employees will not be responsible for any accident or loss which may occur to any exhibitor, spectators, guest, rider, groom, attendant or other employee, animal or equipment at any of the competition.
- b) "All owners and competitors are personally responsible for damages to third persons caused by themselves, their employees, their agents or their horses. They are therefore strongly advised to take out third-party insurance providing full coverage for participation in equestrian events at home and abroad, and to keep the policy up to date."

29. **Electrical/Fire Regulations:**

All electrical installation and connections must meet all state and county codes. Aisles shall be maintained clear for a minimum of six feet wide by eight feet high. No obstructions or projections shall be allowed in these aisles. No Class 1 Flammable liquids such as gasoline, are allowed inside the Buildings or Tents. Anyone found in violation shall be subject to dismissal from further participation in the horse show without recourse.

30. Should any question arise that is not provided for in the rules, the same shall be referred to the competition committee whose decision shall be final. In exceptional circumstances, together with the approval of the Ground Jury the OC reserves the right to modify the schedule in order to clarify any matters or matters arising from an omission or due to unforeseen circumstances. Any such changes must be notified to all competitors and officials as soon as possible and they must be reported to the Secretary General by the Foreign Judge.

30. Traders Point Hunt Charity Horse Show upholds all USEF rules on the Welfare of the Horse and Abuse, Poling and Whip policies. The use of offsets and poling will not be permitted at this show.
