No.	Botanical Name	Common Name	Origin	Label Text
	<i>Aeonium "Velour"</i>			A stunning plant to 50cm tall forming loose rosettes to 25cm in diameter of tapered green leaves that turn deep maroon-black in cool weather.
	<i>Anthemis "Mrs E C Buxton"</i>			The evergreen mounds of mossy green fernlike leaves are smothered in warm soft lemon daisies from mid spring until mid summer. Sun loving and tolerant of some dryness. 50cm. X 90 cm.
	<i>Bauhinia natalensis</i>	Natal Bauhinia	South Africa	Beautiful evergreen shrub 1.5m to 2m with large delicate white flowers in summer. Adaptable to most well-drained soils. Full sun.
	<i>Buckinghamia celsissima</i>	Ivory Curl Tree	Qld	Tall tree in natural habitat but 7-8m in cultivation in cooler climates. Very attractive foliage and large racemes of ivory flowers in summer.
	<i>Buddleja davidii "Nano Purple"</i>			A very vigorous, free-flowering shrub to a height and spread of 1 x 2m. Bears narrow terminal panicles averaging 23 x 6 cm of rich purple-violet flowers with orange eyes, delicately perfumed, that attract butterflies.
	<i>Buddleja davidii "Dark Knight"</i>	Butterfly bush		The fragrant arching clusters are irresistible to birds and butterflies. Really a shrub, plants are best treated like perennials and pruned back hard each spring to maintain a compact, bushy habit. This selection has long wands of dark purple flowers, on a tall clump. Excellent for cutting. Removing faded flower heads will encourage plants to continue flowering. Drought and heat tolerant once established.
	<i>Chasmatophyllum willomoreense</i>		S. Africa	Low-growing succulent with yellow flowers in summer.
	<i>Choisya ternata</i>	Mexican Orange Blossom	Mexico	Evergreen shrub to 2m x 2m with white sweetly scented flowers. Fertile, well-drained soil in a protected, sunny position. Drought and frost resistant. Makes an attractive low hedge.
	<i>Cordyline petiolaris</i>	Broad-leaved Palm Lily	Australia	Warm rainforest plant to 5m. White or lilac flowers, red berries. Moist soil in semi-shade. Frost tender.
	<i>Cornus pumila</i>	Dwarf red-tipped Dogwood		A dwarf slow-growing deciduous dogwood that typically grows in a shrubby mound to 1-2 m tall. It's common name refers to the new foliage at the branch end which emerges crimson red with the red colour persisting through the summer and providing interesting contrast with the mature green leaves on the shrub. Whitish flowers in clusters appear in late spring. Leaves turn red in Autumn.
	<i>Correa glabra var. turnbullii</i> syn. <i>Correa schlechtendalii</i>	Rock correa	Australia	Low shrub with red tubular flowers in winter. Well-drained clay, loam. Shade or part sun. Occasional summer water. Frost resistant
	<i>Crowea exalata</i>	Crowea	NSW & Vic	Small rounded shrub to 70cm. Pink star-like flowers. Well-drained mulched acid or neutral soil. Afternoon or dappled shade. Attractive in pots. Drought and frost resistant.

	<i>Desfontania spinosa</i>		Chile & Peru	Evergreen shrub to 2.5m x 2m. 4 cm long red tubular flowers tipped with yellow in summer and autumn. Cherry-like fruits.. Moist acid soil in protected, shaded position. Drought and frost tender.
	<i>Doryanthes palmeri</i>	Lily	Australia	A dense rosette of arching leaves with a flower stalk reaching over 3m in height with masses of bright scarlet funnel-shaped flowers which appear in summer. A striking accent, border plant, very effective for mass planting under trees in large-scale landscapes such as parkland situations.
	<i>Dyckia encholinioides</i>		S. America	Of the Bromeliad family. Well-drained soil. Drought tolerant. See around Amazon water-lily pavilion in Adelaide Botanic Garden.
	<i>Eremophila polyclada x divaricata</i>	Emu bush	Aust.	Low shrub 1mHx2mW with large lavender flowers in summer. Well-drained soil. Needs little water after establishment on plains. Prune after flowering. Full sun.
.	<i>Eremophila polyclada x drummondii</i>	Blue emu bush	Australia	Hardy low shrub with lavender-blue flowers in spring. Well-drained soil. Full sun.
	<i>Erysimum chieri</i>	Wallflower		Perennial with one or more highly branching stems reaching to 15-80 cm. A delicate perfume and flowers for a long period.
	<i>Escallonia "Pink Pixie"</i>			Compact shrub with a mass of bright pink flowers through spring and summer, on top of vibrant glossy green foliage. Ideal as a low to medium hedge, or to brighten a dull spot. Very hardy, tolerating a wide range of conditions.
	<i>Felicia elongate</i>		South Africa	A striking perennial daisy, with large white or mauve flowers. This daisy is quite special to see in the wild, growing naturally only on limestone hills along the west coast of South Africa, which is known for its beautiful and unique flora.
	<i>Geranium "Rambling Robin"</i>		South Africa	A hybrid between two species, <i>G. Incanum</i> and <i>G. Robustum</i> . Trailing habit of former and vigour of the latter. It produces large lavender-pink flowers for most of spring, summer and autumn. Frost, heat and drought tolerant and will grow 30cm tall by 60 50 80cm across.
	<i>Grevillea stenomera</i>		Australia	A low growing grevillea about 1-1.5m H x 1-2m W. Has very attractive red flowers predominately in winter-spring. Responds well to light pruning and has a nice bushy habit. Bird-attracting.
	<i>Goodenia varia</i>	Goodenia	S.Australia, NSW, Vic.	Hardy, quick-growing groundcover with bright yellow flowers for a long period. Full sun or part shade.
	<i>Justicia rizzini</i>		Central America	Evergreen shrub to .6m x 1m with scarlet bract flowers. Light to medium well-drained soil in sunny position. Frost resistant. Drought tender.

	<i>Lepiderima pulchella</i>	Fine-leaved	Queensland	A small rainforest tree to 15m with beautiful leaves and yellow to orange

	<i>Leptospermum laevigatum</i>	Tea tree	Australia	Large dense shrub, good for coastal planting, white flowers
	<i>Leucophyllum frutescens</i>	Texas sage	Texas	Compact medium-sized evergreen shrub with pinkish flowers in summer. Well-drained alkaline soil. Full sun. Drought tolerant. Prune lightly.
	<i>Myrtus communis "compacta"</i>	Myrtle	Mediterranean	Small evergreen shrub adaptable to most soils. Frost resistant. White, five-petalled flowers in spring and summer.
	<i>Phlomis platystegia</i>		Israel	Rare & beautiful evergreen shrub from Aegean mountains. Golden yellow flowers. Adapted to dry conditions.
	<i>Pelargonium crispum</i>	Lemon geranium	S. Africa	Evergreen shrub approx .7m x .3m. Well-drained soil. Semi-shade to full sun. Pink flowers in summer.
	<i>Phygelius aequalis</i>		S. Africa	Semi-evergreen shrub to 2m tall x 1 m wide, with 25cm long panicles of pink flowers
	<i>Plectranthus argentatus</i>		Australia	Attractive fast-growing, spreading groundcover with soft grey leaves, pale blue flowers. Good in dry shade.
	<i>Plectranthus verticillatus</i>		S.E.Africa	Pleasantly aromatic, soft, perennial herb to 0.25m H, with attractive leaves and white flowers. Semi-succulent, branches prostrate to ascending, rooting at nodes. Good groundcover, indoor plant or hanging basket in shade.
	<i>Prostanthera incise</i>	Mint bush	Australia – NSW	Evergreen rounded shrub (1.5m x .5m). Highly aromatic leaves and deep mauve flowers in spring. Useful for a screen or understory with open crowned trees. Prefers moist well-drained soil with some protection from direct sunlight. Prune back one third after flowering for compact form. Grows well in Adelaide hills.
	<i>Salvia fruiticosa</i>	Greek sage	Eastern Mediterranean including southern Italy, the Canary Islands and North Africa.	A perennial shrub which grows 1m x 1m with flower stalks rising above the foliage. The entire plant is covered with hairs, with numerous leaves of various sizes growing in clusters, giving it a silvery and bush appearance. The flowers are pinkish-lavender, about 1.3cm long, growing in whorls along the inflorescence.
	<i>Salvia officinalis</i>	Garden sage	Mediterranean	Evergreen shrub .07 H x .05W. Limestone soil, open, sunny position. Drought and frost resistant. Bluish-purple flowers in summer.
	<i>Salvia officinalis "Icterina"</i>			An evergreen dwarf sub-shrub with aromatic leaves greyish, variegated with yellow and pale green. Two-lipped pale purplish-blue flowers 2cm long in terminal racemes.
	<i>Santolina "Edward Bowles"</i>			A low, tidy evergreen shrubby mound of finely-feathered greyish green leaves. During summer the whole plant is smothered by the loveliest pale lemon lacy buttons. A very drought-tolerant plant.
	<i>Saxifraga paniculata</i>		Europe	Mat-forming perennial. Spread 25cm. To 5 cm. High. Creamy white flowers in small heads in summer. Free draining fertile soil, part shade.
	<i>Stylidium graminifolium</i>	Trigger plant	Australia	The most widespread of the Stylidium species. It is a tufted, grass-like plant

				with small pink (occasionally white) flowers about 10mm in diameter on stalks up to 40cm high from the centre of the grassy clump. The flowers have 5 petals, although only 4 are conspicuous with the fifth being reflexed and located behind the “trigger” which protrudes from the throat of the floral tube.
	<i>Taxus baccata</i>	Yew	Europe	Erect evergreen tree to 20m x 4m. Open position. Summer water.
	<i>Thymus citriodorus</i> “argenteus”	Silver Thyme		Mat-forming perennial with lemon-scented leaves and lilac flowers in summer. Well-drained neutral to alkaline soil. Full sun.
	<i>Thymus citriodorus</i>	Lemon Thyme		Lemon-scented evergreen mat-forming perennial growing to 0.1m high by 0.3m in spread. It prefers full sun and well drained soil. Flowers from mid to late summer with pink to lavender flowers that are a nectar source for bees and butterflies. The leaves are used as a flavouring herb in cooking, raw in salads, and for herbal teas.
	<i>Trachelospermum jasminoides</i> ‘Variegatum’	Variegated Star Jasmine	S. China	Evergreen vine, with variegated leaves. Carries foliage to ground level. Open, sunny position or part shade. White, fragrant flowers in clusters.
	Wetland plants (tubestock)		S. Aust.	A range of a few local wetland plants in tubes is also available, including <i>Cyperus virgatus</i> , <i>Carex tereticaulis</i> , <i>Marsilea drummondii</i> .
