Food for Thought:

According to the latest reports, our homeland, Australia, is one of the most affluent nations on earth. The 2014 Credit Suisse Global Wealth Report shows that Australian adults have the second highest wealth level of any country on the planet (second only to Switzerland), and that our median wealth level per adult is the highest on earth, more than double Switzerland's. This means that we're not only extremely wealthy (even though we may not realize it), but our wealth is also more evenly distributed than most other nations.

Do the Maths!

It has been estimated that \$100,000 invested into five children over twenty years in an orphanage to pay for food, housing, medical and educational costs and clothing will support just five children from babyhood through to age twenty when they have left the orphanage.

Yet it is estimated that the same \$100,000 invested in microfinance loans for the extreme poor over the same twenty years will help support 86,000 children and their parents by empowering them to start small businesses (of their choice), put more than one meal on the table each day, have clean water with its resultant better family health, educate the children, and have enough left over to be able to help their other less fortunate neighbours.
