I have used the KJV since becoming a Christian, throughout my schooling, and in ministry. I have done all of my memorization from the KJV. I find it more poetic, and more reverent (even though the original text does not demand thee, thou, thine, etc.). I find value in the -eth endings used to show a continuous action. One of my greatest appreciations for the KJV is the simple work done with italics to show supplied words. However, my conviction is that I will not use a translation because I am told to do so, because my family uses it, because I have so much invested in it, or because it is just what I am accustomed to using. If I were one to cling to any of those things, I would not be a Christian today. All translations show forth some variation of doctrinal bias and have some areas in which they could be improved. This is why it is so important that we address the 'translation debate', not by condemning, but by encouraging people to see what is inaccurate in the translation of their choosing.

Additional note:

There are four renderings of the ESV: 2001, 2007, 2011, and the latest is the 2016 "Permanent Text", called such as to indicate there will be no more revisions. The variations between them are minor, yet grammatically productive. All of this tract applies to each of them.

DIFFERENCES IN TRANSLATION

In putting this together, I was constantly reminded of the differences between the translation practices based on the Westcott-Hort method, WH, and the Majority Text method which leans on the Textus Receptus, TR. My conclusion is that the Majority Text (TR) advocates are terrified of leaving anything out of the Word, and that the Ancient Text (WH) advocates are terrified of adding to the Word. We should appreciate efforts on both sides, as we are commanded not to 'add to' nor to 'take away' from God's Word. Both have good reasons for their differences and it shows how much more certainty we can have concerning all of the verses that are not brought into question by either side (99.998% of the text). The majority of arguments I investigated against the ESV were witch hunts that were aptly dispelled by the context. Many accusations of translator bias, I found to be a difference in the manuscripts on which each was based; several others were shown to not be bias by directing one with references to a passage that refuted such.
