

Oklahoma State University (OSU) is accepting applications for a full-time post-doctoral research fellowship position in **behavioral medicine/health psychology, with an emphasis on obesity treatment research.**

This full-time, one-year Fellowship begins Fall 2016 and is renewable for additional year(s). Pay is competitive with NIH guidelines. The successful candidate will be expected to work closely with an OSU Psychology Department faculty mentor implementing an NIH-funded K23 research trial examining the cognitive and self-regulatory mechanisms of obesity and weight loss.

The fellow will be expected to participate in a productive research program while leading evidence-based behavioral weight loss treatment groups as part of the K23 trial. Although publishing results from the weight loss trial will be a primary focus, other research opportunities exist for interested candidates. Specifically, equipment and resources are available for eye-tracking, body composition, blood pressure, and EKG analyses. The fellow will be expected to seek extramural funding and will have the opportunity to hone grantsmanship skills via one-on-one mentoring and university trainings. Other clinical and supervision opportunities are also available for applicants seeking to prepare for eventual licensure, as the department has an active in-house clinic. A 1:1 teaching load is also expected. The fellow will have access to professional development opportunities (e.g., workshops) and resources (e.g., travel stipend).

The primary mentor will be Dr. Misty Hawkins, an Assistant Professor in the Department of Psychology at Oklahoma State University (OSU). OSU is a land grant university that has a strong commitment to institutional research, as evidenced by the \$255 million that was awarded in the 2014 fiscal year. OSU holds NIH-funded awards from multiple federal institutions including the NINR, NIDDK, NHLBI, and NCI as well as grants from state institutions such as the Oklahoma Center for Advancement of Science and Technology (OCAST). The Psychology Department is among the top most productive departments in the College of Arts and Sciences and has 24 full-time faculty members with national and international reputations.

Applicants with a PhD in Clinical or Counseling Psychology and completion of an APA-accredited internship are encouraged to apply.

Review of applications will begin immediately and will continue until the position is filled. Priority will be given to applications submitted by February 15, 2016.
