Please note

- The essay must be the participant's original own work which has not been published nor submitted elsewhere. Manuscripts will not be returned, please keep a copy if needed;
- Schools please encourage as many students as possible to participate, select the excellent works and send them to addresses according to the different language groups;
- Categories:** Writings will be classified according to the following categories:
(B) **Non-native speakers:** Both parents or foster parents are not ethnic Chinese;
(C) **Native Chinese:** Chinese candidates who have studied for more than 4 years in China;
(BBC) **Overseas Chinese:** British-born Chinese or Chinese who have been in China for under 3 years;
- There is no entry fee. Each competitor is limited to submit one piece of work; and
- The organizers reserve the right to modify and publish entries. Authors agree not to ask for any payment.

Awards

The winners' list will be announced in mid-May. There will be first place, second place and third place certificates for each category group.
