BODICE FRONT AND BACK CUT ONE OF EACH NOTE NECKLINES ARE DIFFERENT







ONCE ALL TAPED TOGETHER SELECT THE SIZE YOU WISH TO MAKE, SEE OUR SIZE CHART AND CUT OUT YOUR PAPER PATTERN PIECES.

Gutting

CUT THE BODICES OUT, FRONT AND BACK. NOTE THE BACK AND FRONT NECKLINES. CUT THE WAIST PANEL OUT AS INDICATED AND TWO SKIRT PANELS. ALSO CUT 2" WIDE BIND-ING STRIPS ON THE BIAS OF THE FABRIC. YOU WILL NEED ABOUT 130" IN LENGTH, SO JOIN THE STRIPS.

Tewing Instructions Note: All SEAMS ARE 3/8" UNIESS OTHERWISE STATED!

- Refer to the diagrams on the next page. Place the front and back bodice right sides facing and pin the shoulders together as shown in fig. 1. Stitch. Press.
- Place the two waist panel pieces together, right sides together and stitch side seams. Press.
- See fig.3., we simply created a rolled hem on both sides of the panels by rolling the fabric edge 1/4" onto the wrong side of the fabric, and press; roll again 1/4" and press. Stitch.
- Repeat for along the hemline.
- Using the bias binding, bind the neckline and the two open sides of the bodice as shown in fig.5. Pin the binding right sides facing onto the edge as shown, and stitch. Press the seam allowance upward onto the binding as shown in fig.6; and roll the raw edge of the binding 1/4" onto the wrong side of the binding as shown -
- Roll the binding over the seam allowance encasing raw edges. See fig.7. Stitch. Press.



- Refer to fig.8 at the sides of the bodice, overlap the bottom edge 1" as shown. Begin pinning the waist panel in place as shown in fig.9. right sides facing. Adjust the cross over of each side so the bodice fits the top edge of the waist panel. Stitch the waist panel onto the bodice as shown.
- Mark the center of the back panel along the raw top edge, and mark the center back point of the waist panel. Pin the skirt panel onto the waist panel, right sides facing - continue to pin the panel in place which will wrap around the side edges of the tunic slightly. Stitch the back skirt in place. Press.
- Repeat for the front skirt panel. This piece will overlap the back skirt panel. See fig. 10.
