
SIMPLY PRINT OUT THIS PDF DOWNLOAD PATTERN ON LETTER SIZE PAPER (8.5x11 IN US OR EURO SIZE)

Tape all the join lines together. It's that simple. For more info see instructions online at www.sewtinagivens.com

ONCE ALL TAPED TOGETHER SELECT THE SIZE YOU WISH TO MAKE, SEE OUR SIZE CHART AND CUT OUT YOUR PAPER PATTERN PIECES.

Cutting

PRINT THE PATTERN PIECES TWICE. WE PRINTED THE BACK AND FRONT TOGETHER. THEN CUT THE BACK AND THE FRONT OUT SO NOW YOU HAVE ONE OF EACH. PLACE BOTH ON THE FOLD OF YOUR FABRIC AND CUT BOTH OUT. CUT 2" WIDE STRIPS FOR BINDING ALONG THE BIAS OF THE FABRIC ALONG SIDE THE BODICE PATTERNS - SEE DIAGRAM!



CUT 6 STRIPS THE WIDTH OF THE FABRIC 3" WIDE.
CUT TWO WIDTHS OF FABRIC 20"; AND TWO WIDTHS
25" FOR THE TWO SKIRTS. IF WANTING TO MAKE THE
SLIP WITH ONE SKIRT - CUT JUST TWO WIDTHS 25"
WIDE. AND 4 STRIPS THE WIDTH OF THE FABRIC 3"
WIDE.

## SewingInstructions

Note: ALL SEAMS ARE 3/8"
UNLESS OTHERWISE STATED!

- Refer to diagrams on page 2 of these instructions.
- French seam bodice by placing the back bodice and the front bodice, wrong sides facing; and pin along shoulders, and side seams. Stitch. Press.
- Turn the bodice inside out and again pin the shoulders and side seams, as in fig. 1. and stitch again. Press.
- Using the bias strips you precut, use one for each armhole and one for the neckline. Pin the strip raw edge to raw edge around an armhole, beginning and ending under the arm. Pin, trim and join the strip before stitching onto the garment.

- Stitch the strip in place, and press the seam allowance upward onto binding. Fold the raw edge of the binding onto its wrong side, see fig.2 to 3. and press. Roll this folded edge over the seam allowance and pin down. Fig.3. Stitch binding down.
- Repeat for the other armhole, and for the neck. The join for the neck binding should be at back center.
- French seam the 20" skirt pieces together by stitching wrong side together first, and then right sides facing. Repeat for the second longer skirt, press both.
- If using just one skirt we recommend using the longer one with the ruffle.
- To finish the upper skirt, use two of the 3" wide strips. First fold each in half lengthwise, right sides facing outward, and press, see fig.5. Tuck short ends in too, press.
- Place a strip starting at side seam on shorter skirt, raw edges to raw edges onto the right side of the fabric, as in fig. 6. And pin the strip along the hem; overlap at the end, with the second strip. This should then overlap the first. Stitch this in place, press downward.
- Using the 4 remaining strips, again fold in half lengthwise as in fig.5. and press, tuck in short edges and press. Now ruffle or gather or make small pleats, as in fig. 7 along the raw edged side. Each piece should be roughly a little more than half of what it once was.
- Again, place these ruffled strips along the raw edge of the longer skirt, on the right side of the fabric, overlap each one until all hem is pinned. Stitch in place. Zigzag or serge all raw edges to finish.

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- + ... CONTINUED
- Press ruffle downward, and seam allowance upward - topstitch 1/4" above the seam around the hemline catching the seam allowance inside to secure.
- Place both skirts right side out, and place the shorter skirt over the longer skirt. Pin around the waist. Ruffle or make 1" pleats or gather the top edge to fit the bottom edge of the bodice.
- Baste pleats/gathers in place.
- Turn skirts (now sewed together at the top edge) inside out, and turn the bodice right side out.
- Place the bodice upside down into the skirts and match the waist edges of the bodice bottom to the skirt top. Pin together all the way around making sure side seams match.
- Stitch together. Finish raw edges by serging or zigzag.
- Turn slip right side out and press.
- If making in light cotton or linen, launder the garment after it is made, and use a medium heat dryer. Hang when almost dry and steam or press.
