CAPE'S CHARTER

GOALS:

1. to foster academic (personal) excellence

- -total integration of subjects
- -through individualized flexible programs

2. to foster personal excellence

- -through a counselling approach to discipline & democratic problem solving
- -through Wellness projects

PHILOSOPHY AND BELIEFS:

At CAPE, we believe:

- (a) students wish for, need, and deserve an individualized, flexible, and innovative program, which will lead to success in academic pursuits;
- **(b)** students wish for, need, and deserve an affordable, supportive, equitable, responsive, and accessible educational environment within which to grow and develop personal and academic skills, which will lead to active world citizenship:
- (c) students have the right to become involved in an educational program of choice;
- (d) each student presents with particular academic and personal needs because of different cognitive, emotional, and social developmental rates;
- (e) students, for a variety of reasons, are sometimes not able to achieve their academic and personal best within other, locally available standard educational programs;
- **(f)** students, when placed in an appropriate environment, have the potential of becoming successful students and life-long learners;
- (g) administrators, teachers, parents, and students are partners in the academic and personal development of the student;
- (h) the community at large has a role to play in the academic and personal development of the student.

PURPOSE:

- (3) The mandate of CAPE is to provide an individualized, integrated program for Kindergarten to Grade 9 students who are intellectually capable underachievers.
- (4) CAPE's kindergarten is a voluntary pre-school educational program offered to eligible children. The kindergarten

program at CAPE emphasizes a developmental process that encourages students to grow intellectually, physically, socially, and emotionally at a rate that respects the potential of each individual child.

OUTCOMES:

(7) (a) Academic Excellence

- (1) Student learning is improved so that students are working at their own personal best;
- (2) Student progress shows above average growth;
- (3) Students become well-rounded individuals with a broad knowledge base;
- (4) Students have a greater awareness of the world around them through exposure to other cultures, ideas, and beliefs.

(b) Personal Excellence

- (1) Students have acquired personal and interpersonal skills so that they may become productive citizens of the world and life-long learners;
- (2) Students learn the importance of caring for others, learn respect for others, and treat others fairly.

A BRIEF HISTORY of CAPE

- began operating in September 1994 as a private school
- was granted a charter by MHSD No. 76 in June 1995, becoming one of the first three public charter schools in Alberta
- was fully evaluated by a 2-member Alberta Education team in April 1998
- CAPE's charter was renewed for a 3 year term by the Minister of Education in June 1998
- was evaluated by a 5-member Alberta Education team in April 1999
- underwent an external evaluation in October 2000
- a 5-year charter was granted in May 2001
- moved to its new school site in September 2001 (the old St. Louis School in the flats)
- an external evaluation was conducted in 2004
- a 5-year charter was granted in February 2006
- an external evaluation was conducted in 2008
- a 5-year charter was granted in February 2011
- an external evaluation was conducted in April 2014
