## High School and College Nationals Report

The High School and Collegiate National Judo Championships were held in Spokane, Washington in March. Some impressive talent was showcased in the two competitions. With competing sports and activities vying for their focus, retaining and developing the promising young players is a formidable challenge for American Judo.

## Spokane's Shinohara? Potential Pitfalls of Video Review

Popular with the fans of football, a coach has one chance in each half of a game to challenge a ruling on the field; inconclusive video review results in keeping the call made on the field. When a challenge is refuted or inconclusive, the team making the challenge is penalized with the loss of a time-out. Judo coaches and fans often wish there was such a system in judo to correct injustices, and even the director of the PJU Referee Commission thinks it is coming (see Diaz interview, page 3).

The Collegiate National Judo Championships gold medal match in the men's -73 kg division ended as a tribute to the need for and the problems that might be associated with video review. The referee called "ippon" and white jumped up ecstatic with his perceived victory. The crowd was led to chant "blue" by teammates of the blue player. The officials conferred and awarded the match to the blue player. The coach of the white player and most of the crowd expressed disbelief, and the referee commission met with the officials as they left the mat. After several minutes in conference, they returned to the mat and attempted to recall the players to the mat; apparently, the officials had decided to reverse the decision. The coach of the blue player instructed his player to not return to the mat, and other high level referees intervened with the opinion that since the officials had left the mat the decision was not able to be reversed.

Upon subsequent video review of several films, white clearly initiated and executed the throw, a rolling kata guruma that, depending on the angle from which the tape was made, deserved ippon (in which case the wrong player won) or alternatively hansukomake for a head dive (in which case the correct player won). What is the moral of the story? Even video review won't solve every difficult officiating question in dynamic judo matches. And things that seem painfully wrong or unjust can teach us lessons about character, emotion, perspective, and the healing power of time.

The white player was given a silver medal and a special sportsmanship award.
