he purpose of the workshop is to share information about agricultural hydropower opportunities within central Colorado and to identify agricultural producers that might be interested in benefitting from new federal and state incentives. In 2013, federal small hydro permitting reform legislation became law, dramatically simplifying federal approval for small hydro. In 2014, the Colorado Department of Agriculture is developing a new program to support development of agricultural hydropower and NRCS will start allowing agricultural hydropower equipment to be an eligible reimbursable equipment type under the EQIP grant program.
