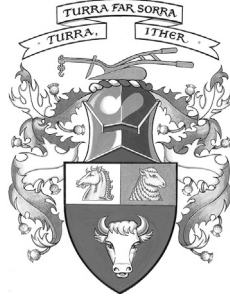

All entries must be made on the attached entry
schedule, signed by the exhibitor and delivered to the
Secretary not later than **Saturday, 9th July, 2016.**

No entries will be accepted after that date



RULES

1. The Exhibition is open to all comers.
2. All Exhibits must be the bona fide work of the Exhibitor in whose name the Entry is made and must have been worked since 1st August 2015.
3. No intending Exhibitor may make more than one entry in any class, except in the Shepherd's Crooks and Walking Sticks Section where two entries per class is allowed.
4. All Entries must be made to the Secretary of the Agricultural Association on the appropriate Entry Form, supplied for the purpose, which must reach the Secretary not later than SATURDAY, 9th JULY, 2016.
5. All Exhibits must be delivered to the Committee of Management within the Marquee in the Showfield from 7.00 a.m. until 9.30 a.m. on SUNDAY, 31st JULY. Where Exhibitors find it impossible or inconvenient to deliver Exhibits personally, such Exhibits will be carefully attended to if forwarded addressed to the Secretary of the Association to be in their hands not later than 9.30 a.m. on SUNDAY, 31st JULY, and will be returned to their respective owners after the Show.
6. While every care will be taken of Exhibits, such shall be entirely at the Exhibitor's own risk. The Association shall not be liable for any loss or damage Exhibits may sustain at the Show or in transit.
7. Judging shall commence at 10.00 a.m. on SUNDAY, 31st JULY. **EXHIBITS SHALL BE REMOVED BETWEEN 5.00 P.M. AND 5.30 P.M. ON MONDAY, 1ST AUGUST.**
8. In Points Competition a First Prize shall be awarded 4 Points; a Second Prize, 3 Points; a Third Prize, 2 Points; and a Fourth Prize, 1 Point.
9. Judges have the right to turn out contents of Jars, Bottles or other Containers, and to cut or break Cakes, etc.
10. In the interest of food hygiene, it is recommended that all food items exposed to the open air be discarded in waste bags provided by the Association, when collecting entries after the Show.
11. No Challenge of Entries, Classification of Exhibits, Awards of the Judges, or any other procedure shall be competent after 1 p.m. of the second day of the Show, and all Challenges, must be lodged with the Secretary in writing before that time along with £5 which shall be forfeited to the Association should it be the opinion of the Committee of Management that the protest was raised on unreasonable grounds. The Committee shall have the power to settle all disputed questions connected with the Exhibition, and against their decision there shall be no appeal.
12. Prize Money will be paid not later than 1st October, 2016. Prize money from the Children's Section and Classes 246 and 247 can be collected from the secretary's office after 11am on MONDAY, 1st AUGUST.
13. Fifth and Sixth prize cards may be awarded but with no points or money value.

Work 30 rows in stocking stitch (1 row K, 1 row P)

Cast on 12 stitches at beginning of next 2 rows and change to K2, P2 (for the sleeves)

Rib 22 more rows

Next row: (for the Neck) rib 21, cast off 26 sts, rib 21

Next row: rib 21, cast on 26, rib 21

Work 22 rows K2, P2

Cast off 12 sts at beginning of next 2 rows

Work 30 rows in stocking stitch

Work 18 rows K2, P2

Cast off

Sew up the side seams
