## BIOSECURITY PROTOCOLS

Lala Land Productions LLC is dedicated to the health, welfare and safety of all exhibitors both equine and human. To protect our equine partners, we will be enforcing the following protocols at the unrecognized Citrus Circuit, the USEF C-Rated Shows and the USEF A-Rated shows

All horses stabling on the Jim Brandon grounds arrive after noon and before 6 p.m. If it is necessary to arrive at any other time you must notify management and additional fees may be applied.

1. A current negative Coggins test is required. It is strongly recommended that all horses be vaccinated for Equine EHV-1 (either modified live or killed vaccine) no sooner than 7 days prior and no later than 90 days prior to entering the show grounds.
2. For those stabling at the Jim Brandon Equestrian Center, a Health Certificate must be signed by a licensed veterinarian within 15 days of arrival at the Jim Brandon Equestrian Center, documenting that the horse has:
  - a. Received regular and consistent vaccination against Equine Influenza and EHV 1 & 4 with most recent booster being within 90 days and not within 7 days.
  - b. Not shown symptoms of or been treated for EHV-4/1 within the past 28 days.
  - c. Not been at a facility under quarantine for EHV-4/1 or exposed to any horses showing symptoms of EHV-4/1 within the past 28 days
3. Current vaccination against WNV, EEE, WEE, Tetanus and Rabies is strongly recommended.
4. No horses will be allowed admittance with elevated temperatures. It is recommended that you establish a log of temperatures taken at least twice daily. If there is an elevated temperature for more than a 24-hour period, please consult your local veterinarian immediately.
5. Every effort should be made to minimize stress and comingling of horses shipped to the Jim Brandon facility.
6. Any horse on the show grounds with a fever must be reported to Lala Land Productions and may be required to withdraw from competition. In addition, isolation of the horse may be required by the Florida Department of Agriculture.
7. Please take the time to review equine good hygiene practices. Please convey the importance of this to your equine caretakers for their daily routines.

Lala Land Productions LLC strives to provide a safe and enjoyable show experience. An important part of that experience is maintaining healthy horses. # RULES AND REGULATIONS

## General Rules

- Only bedding and manure is to be placed in manure bins.
- Trash must be placed in the proper receptacles, including recycle bins when available.
- No glass, all liquids must be enclosed in shatter proof containers.
- No vehicles are permitted to park within 30 feet of any stabling facility unless loading or un- loading. You are allowed 15 minutes upon arrival to unload after which time you must move your vehicle to a designated parking area away from the barns, or the vehicle may be towed at theowner's expense.

## Arrival and Departure

- If a show has exhibitors who wish to arrive early (before noon of the day before the show date) JBEC cannot guarantee availability of specific stalls, and show management may incur an early arrival fee.
- Before placing horses in stalls, check with Show Manager or Barn Manager to receive stall assignments. Barn Manager is an adult named by Show Management as a representative to be present during event move-in to insure this policy is enforced, to un-lock stalls and collect all stall fees, and to make sure all vehicles load and unload in a timely fashion.
- Only 1 horse per stall, unless nursing mare with foal.
- Initial stall bedding is not supplied and is available for purchase. No outside vendor may deliver shavings to competitors. Stalls must be adequatelybedded, no horses are allowed in dry stalls.
- No nailing into stall walls, or alterations of stalls.

## Health and Safety

- All personal injury or property damage must be reported to the Show Management.
- All exhibitors and riders are required to wear properly fitting protective headgear. All riders must wear ASTM/ SEI approved helmets with the harness secured when mounted on the competition grounds.
- No smoking in barns, buildings, offices, or around manure receptacles.
- All medical waste must be kept separate from manure and trash, and disposed of in the proper receptacles provided (Sharps containers).
- No horses will be lunged in any show or schooling ring. There are designated lunging areas.
- Horses are to be washed in designated wash stalls only.
- All dogs must be on a leash no longer than 6 feet at all times, and must be picked up after and the waste disposed of in manure receptacles. Show office is off limits to dogs unless required by the disabled. Dogs must yield to horses.
- Horses cannot be tied to bars on stall fronts, or stall doors, fences, gates, pavilions, or other equipment. Horses may be tied to tie rings in stalls.
- Horses shall not be loose or unattended when not stabled.
- Horses are not permitted to be turned out in any arena, including round pens.
- At the horse show judges' discretion horses and/or ponies may be eliminated from competition for unsoundness and or distruptive or unsafe behavior.

## Vehicles and Parking

- All motorized vehicles, including but not limited to cars, trucks, golfcarts, motor

cycles, Mopeds, etc. shall only be driven by licensed drivers. They are to be driven in a safe and courteous manner at all times and are to be parked only in designated areas. No golf carts or motor bikes shall be permitted in other areas designated for horse traffic only. Golf carts will be impounded by security or park personnel if underage drivers are caught operating them. Golf cart usage will be strictly monitored.

- Anyone operating a motorized vehicle of any type on the premises must have in their possession a valid driver's license. This applies to golf carts, mopeds, motorcycles, cars, trucks, etc. Children who have a valid learners' permit may operate the above mentioned motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid drivers' license.
- No trailers shall be unhooked on any of the asphalt roadways.
- No skateboards, in-line skates, or roller skates are allowed.

### **Minor Exhibitors**

- Parent(s) or guardian(s) of minor exhibitors shall hold the Horse Show Management and the Facility harmless for any injury to such minor. No child's entry will be accepted or number issued unless entry is signed by a parent or legal guardian. The signature of unrelated persons will not be accepted.
- Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles on the competition grounds of recognized competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. Penalties may include exclusion of the child, parent(s), guardian(s), and/or trainer(s) from the competition grounds for the remainder of the competition. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

Under Florida law, an equine activity sponsor or equine professional is not liable for an injury to, or death of, a participant in equine activities resultin from the inherent risks of equine activities.

Every class offered herein which is covered in accordance with the rules and specifications of the current USEF Rule Book will be conducted and judged in accordance therewith.

The Horse Show Management reserves the right to interpret all questions and conditions in regard to or arising out of, or incident to the show without claims for damages or recourse of any kind. All questions shall be decided by the Horse Show Management; its decision to be final.

The Horse Show Management and horse show judge reserves the right to limit entries in any class, section or division, to refuse, accept conditionally, or to cancel any entries, disqualify any riders or exhibitors, prohibit exhibition of entries, and cancel award prizes, without any claim for damages; to change any course, to add a dotted line, to cancel or combine any unfilled classes, or to reschedule classes, to change rings or rotate judges; to change specifications in jumper classes as competition warrants. Every horse entered herein for competition will be under the control of the Horse Show Management, but the Show Management will in no case be responsible for any loss or damage that

may occur, and it shall be a condition of entry that each exhibitor shall hold the horse show and the officials, employees, directors, officers, sponsoring entities of the horse show and the facilities at which the horse show is held blameless for any loss or accident to his horse(s), employee(s), or equipment which may occur from sickness, fire or other cause.

**While every effort has been made to avoid mistakes in this publication (the USEF), Lala Land Productions LLC and its management assume no liability to anyone for errors. Any significant errors or changes will be disclosed to competitors whose entries are accepted upon their acceptance, and otherwise in accordance with USEF rules.**

## ENTRIES

The **closing date for entries** of the January Citrus Series show is **Friday December 27, 2013**. After that date fees are non-refundable. All classes \$25 if entered before December 27, 2013. Post entries will be \$35 per class. Please submit entries on **Showgroundslive.com**. Entries may also be sent to the address shown on the entry blank. Checks should be made payable to Lala Land Productions LLC. An open check or credit card is required on file with the Horse Show Secretary for numbers to be issued.

**Stabling:** Stalls are available for \$75.00. No admittance to show grounds before Noon on Friday, January 3. Stalls will be available at Noon, January 3. Stalls must be vacated 1 hour after completion of the last class on Saturday, January 4.

**Check Out:** Any horse show bills not checked out at the conclusion of each show will be assessed a \$50 fee for check out. *Any mistakes at check out must be resolved within 24 hours.* Check your bills carefully.

**Non-Negotiable Checks:** Checks returned by the bank for any reason will be assessed a penalty of \$50 or 10% of the check amount, whichever is greater. Upon notification of a returned check, accounts will be given three (3) days to make full payment, including the penalty, which must be paid in certified funds, cashier's check or money order. Overnight mail service is advised in order to avoid notification of the sanctioning organizations for disciplinary action.

**Back Numbers:** You must wear the back number provided by the show office. Failure to wear your back number during schooling will result in a forfeiture of schooling. Failure to wear your back number during a class will result in disqualification. No refunds will be issued.

## COMPORTEMNT

Show attendees are notified that any act of discourtesy or disobedience to the Judges, show staff, Citrus Series employees on the part of any owner, rider, trainer, or family member, may disqualify the rider or horse. No fees will be refunded due to disqualification. Management decisions are final and will be accepted by competitors.

## CLASS SPECIFICATIONS

**Entry Fees:** All classes \$25 if entered before December 27, 2013. Post entries will be \$35 per class.

If time permits, un-judged “do-overs” allowed for \$25 when all classes at the given height are exhausted.

### Jumper Division

The 45 second rule will be used in all jumper classes. ALL jumper classes may consist of any combination of the following: brush, gate, oxers, posts and rails, water, wall, Liverpool, ditch, panels, coops. All horses entered will be assigned a number and must be checked in with the Paddock Master BEFORE the start of the class. Order of go will be determined by show management. Horses tied for other than first place will be placed on their time in the first round unless otherwise stated.

Classes open to horses and ponies unless otherwise stated. Ponies may be shown by adults and professionals. If a rider is too large for a pony in management’s opinion, they will not be permitted to show.

**Table II Jumpers** will have no jump off. All ties for first will remain tied. There will be a time allotment. The time allotment is the "optimal" time, decided by the course designer and judge, is 6 seconds above and below the optimal time. For each second above or below the time allotment the penalty is 2 faults per second or part of a second. Each rider that completes the course penalty free will receive a Citrus Series orange ribbon.

## Hunter Divisions

Fences found in all hunter classes shall simulate fences found in the hunting field such as: brush, wall, in and out, post and rails, oxer, gate, coop. All classes will be judged in performance and soundness unless otherwise noted.

Ponies may be shown by adults and professionals. If a rider is too large for a pony in management's opinion, they will not be permitted to show.

- **Open Hunter** – Open to professionals and non-professionals. To jump height as indicated in the schedule or respective heights of Sections.
- **Junior/Adult Hunter** – Open to Juniors and Adult Amateurs. To be judged on performance and soundness. Open to horses and ponies.
- **Junior/Adult Equitation** – Open to Juniors and Adult Amateurs. To be judged on seat, guidance and control of mount.
- **Junior/Adult Hunter OF** – Open to Juniors and Adult Amateurs. To be judged on performance and soundness.
- **Junior/Adult Equitation OF** – Open to Juniors and Adult Amateurs. To be judged on seat, hands, guidance and control of mount.

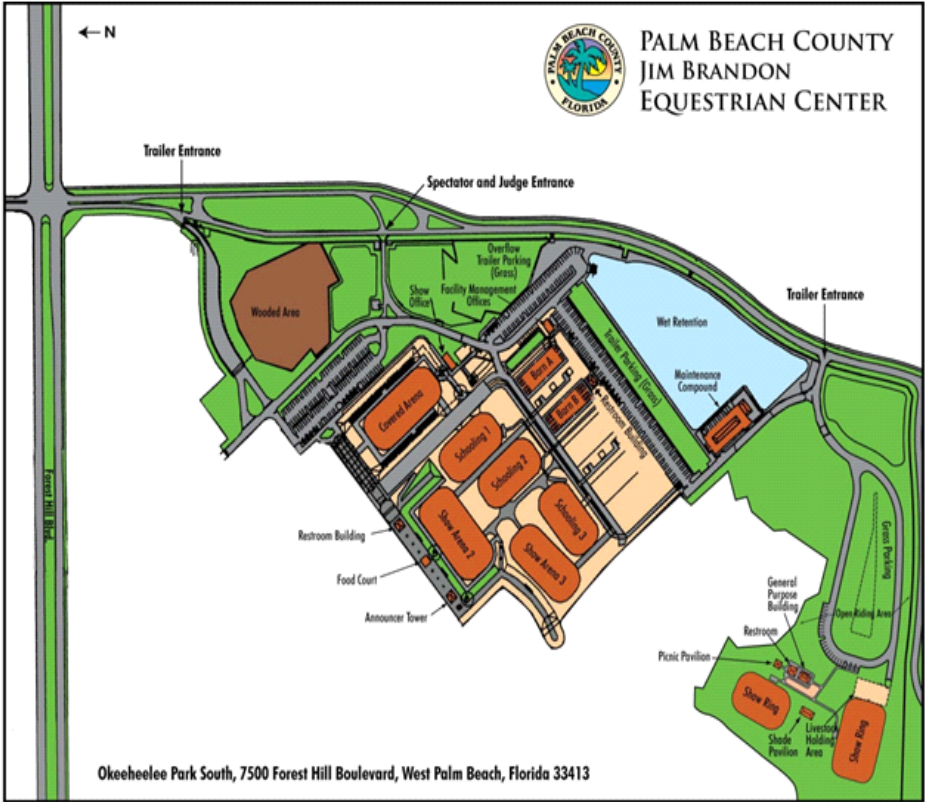

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## DIRECTIONS

### **FROM I-95**

Exit Forest Hill Blvd. Go west on Forest Hill Blvd. for approximately six (6) miles. After passing Pinehurst Dr., make the next left into Okeehelée Park South.

### **FROM the NORTH on FLORIDA'S TURNPIKE**

Exit #97-Southern Blvd. After toll booth, turn left onto Pike Rd. (South). Make a left onto Southern Blvd. (East) and go to Jog Road. Make a right onto Jog Road (South) to Forest Hill Blvd. Make a right onto Forest Hill Blvd. (West). After passing Pinehurst Dr., make a left into Okeehelée Park South.

### **FROM the SOUTH on FLORIDA'S TURNPIKE**

Exit #93-Lake Worth Rd. and go east to Pinehurst Dr. Make a left onto Pinehurst Dr. (North) and go to Forest Hill Blvd. Make a left onto Forest Hill Blvd. (West). Make the next left into Okeehelée Park South.

### **FROM the WEST on FOREST HILL BLVD.**

Cross over Florida's Turnpike and make a right into Okeehelée Park South.

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
