- Apprentices take full responsibility for transporting the item of furniture to and from the Band Stage, Hillary's Boat Harbour on 19th April 2015
- All entries must be at the venue by 7.30am on 19th April 2015
- All entrants must currently be employed and studying an Apprenticeship in Cabinet Making, Furniture Finishing, Wood Machining, Upholstery or Floor Finishing on the 19th April 2015.
- There must be a minimum number of 10 entries for the judging to take place
- Additional materials may be used (at a cost to the apprentice) however the finished item must contain at least 85% of material sourced from the supplied pallets
- The use of drugs and/or alcohol during the event is prohibited

Awards and prizes

• **The National Youth Week Award** - \$750 cash. Open to apprentices 25 or under. Judges will consist of (1) A person nominated by or employee of the Cabinet Making Association of WA (2) A person nominated by or employee of Australian Furniture Association (3) A person nominated by or employee of Food Fibre and Timber Industries Training Council. In the event that all three judges cannot agree then a majority decision will be accepted. Judges decision is final. The Judges will be taking into consideration:

- the use of material
- the apprentices skill level (so as to fairly compare 1st years with 4th years)
- the originality of the piece
- the standard of finishing on the piece (note the piece does not need to be polished or painted but it should be at a level that fits the design).

• **The Apprentice and Traineeship Company Innovation and Design Award** - \$750 cash. Open to all apprentices. Judges will consist of, (1) A person nominated by or employee of the Cabinet Making Association of WA (2) A person nominated by or employee of Australian Furniture Association (3) A person nominated by or employee of Food Fibre and Timber Industries Training Council. In the event that all three judges cannot agree then a majority decision will be accepted. Judges decision is final. The Judges will be taking into consideration:

- the use of material
- the apprentices skill level (so as to fairly compare 1st years with 4th years)
- the originality of the piece
- the standard of finishing on the piece (note the piece does not need to be polished or painted but it should be at a level that fits the design)
- level of innovation
- the design and functionality of the piece (how well does the finished piece do what it's supposed to do).

Please note judging for this award will be heavily weighted towards innovation and design.

• **People's Choice Award** - \$250 Toolmart or Hafele Gift Voucher. 1st and 2nd prizes awarded. Open to all apprentices. Winners will be decided by members of the general public who will vote for their favourite piece. Only 1 vote allowed per person. Voting will commence at 10:00am on the day of the event and conclude at midday. In the event of a tie, voting will be extended for an additional 5 minutes until a point is reached when we have a clear first and second prize winner. Organiser's decision is final. Gift Vouchers cannot be exchanged for cash. The winner must abide with all the terms and conditions of Toolmart or Hafele in relation to the Gift Voucher.

All winners will also receive a free student membership to the Australian Furniture Association
