Managing risks relating to infections in both health & social care environments is a priority for all registered providers of health and social care. Compliance with the Health and Social Care Act (2008) and the Code of Practice for the prevention of infections (2010) is a requirement of registration with the Care Quality Commission.

Providers of Primary Medical Care – GP practices; Out Of Hours (OOH) services; urgent care/walk-in centres – are required to have a nominated lead for Infection Prevention & Control (IPC) and to demonstrate compliance with the Code of Practice (Outcome 8). This RCN accredited course provides delegates with a comprehensive introduction to managing IPC risks in a range of primary care environments and includes the role & responsibilities of the IPC lead.
