

Emergency Shelters

Emergency shelters are temporary residences of desperation for homeless people which seek to protect vulnerable populations from the often devastating effects of homelessness.

Annunciation House (915) 544-1661	Provides hospitality to homeless immigrants, refugees and the undocumented on both sides of the border. Individuals and families.
Recovery Alliance (915) 594-7000	Individuals in recovery from alcoholism or drug addiction.
Center Against Family Violence (915) 593-1000	Provides services for victims of domestic violence; a 24 hour crisis hotline; emergency shelter; non-residential services, and advocacy. Individuals and families.
Center for Children (Runaway Center) (915) 565-8361	24 emergency shelter for runaways and emergency foster care.
Child Crisis Center (915) 562-7955	Emergency shelter and crisis nursery for children ages 0-12. Children only.
Dame La Mano (915) 546-4040	Helps women that are pregnant in crisis or homeless with children.
Opportunity Center (915) 577-0069	Provides Emergency Shelter for individuals without children. Provides food, clothing, medical care, housing, employment counseling and other programs to assist the homeless.
Opportunity Center Women's Shelter (915) 577-0069	Provides Emergency Shelter for women without children. Provides food, clothing, medical care, housing, employment counseling and other programs to assist the homeless.
Rescue Mission of El Paso (915) 532-2575	Help for the homeless including food, clothing, shelter, counseling, job placement, employment for the disabled, drug and alcohol treatment program. Mostly individuals; limited space for families.
Salvation Army (915) 544-9811	Emergency shelter for families in crisis, including three hot meals, all personal grooming items, clothing vouchers, employment and educational referrals, limited counseling services and food boxes.
Sin Fronteras (915)532-0921	Provides temporary shelter, food and social services to agricultural workers, publish and distribute information relative to self-improvement, health education and welfare of farm workers. Individuals only.

Transitional Shelters

Transitional Shelters provide short term (up to 2 years) interim housing for individuals and families experiencing homelessness

Casa Vides (915) 544-1661	Provides hospitality to homeless immigrants, refugees and the undocumented on both sides of the border. Individuals and families.
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Christian Home (915) 778-1810	Operates a 24 hr residential shelter for men helping them return to a productive life through Biblical instruction and peer to peer counseling. Men only.
Freedom House (915) 532-2575	Relapse Prevention Program – designed for men and women in recovery from substance abuse.
Center Against Family Violence TLC (915) 593-1000	Provides transitional shelter and services for victims of domestic violence; residential services, and advocacy.
Independence House (YWCA) (915) 533-2311	Transitional housing for women and women with children; Post crisis bridge housing designed to assist women and children to achieve permanent housing and self-sufficiency.
La Posada Home (915) 544-4595	Provides shelter, food, and clothing, self-improvement classes, tutoring and casework for women and children.
Myrtle TLC (915) 577-0069	Provides shelter, food, clothing, self-improvement classes for single women.
Project Vida (915) 533-7057	Provides primary health care, childcare, transitional shelter for homeless families.
Reynolds House (915) 274-2598	Transitional shelter for homeless families, clothing, counseling and referrals available.
Safe Zone (915) 577-0069	Transitional living program for homeless individuals coming out of detoxification.
Veterans TLC (915) 577-0069	Transitional Living Program for homeless veterans. Men and women. Individuals only.
Villa Maria (915) 544-5500	Transitional Living Program for women without children; shelter, counseling, food and clothing; spiritual needs.
Victory Outcry in the Barrio (915) 838-8887	Drug Alcohol Treatment; housing; referrals; counseling/spiritual needs
Winchester House (915) 534-7227	Transitional Living Program for former foster youth males, ages 18-25 years old.
YWCA – TLC (915) 533-2311	A residential program for homeless women and their children. Offers a supportive environment of housing and counseling services to help homeless women make the transition to independent living.

Permanent Supportive Housing

Permanent Supportive housing is a combination of housing and services intended as a cost-effective way to help people live more stable, productive lives. Supportive housing is primarily for those who face the most complex challenges—individuals and families confronted with homelessness and who also have very low incomes and/or serious, persistent issues that may include substance abuse, addiction or alcoholism, mental illness, HIV/AIDS, or other serious challenges to a successful life

Veterans Lodge – Shelter Plus Care (915) 564-6100	Provides rental assistance and services to chronically homeless veterans with mental illness or other disability.
Magoffin Avenue Safe Haven (915) 577-0069	Provides a stable environment for seriously mentally ill homeless individuals.
Magoffin SRO (Single Resident Occupancy) (915) 577-0069	Provides a safe and stable environment for those who are frail and/or elderly in a Single Occupancy Room residence.
Missouri Street SRO (Single Resident Occupancy) (915) 577-0069	Provides a private room to adults who are in transition from homelessness. Support services are provided by referring agency and coalition members.
Myrtle SRO (915) 577-0069	Provides rental assistance and services in a Single Occupancy Room residence for single women only.
TVP Non Profit Housing Corp. (915) 858-0607	Provides affordable housing for low-income families.

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Outreach

Centro San Vicente – Homeless Outreach Team (915) 351-0233	The Homeless Outreach Team engages homeless individuals and their families to meet their immediate needs with community services and promote transition to permanent housing. The Team provides mobile assistance wherever homeless persons happen to be, whether they are on the streets, in parks, under bridges, along railroad tracks, on river banks, in shelters, or living in cars. Team members are available to work with community shelter staff and other providers, offering support and education about mental illness risk assessment for homeless persons.
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
