GUILLEN SWORN IN AT TEXAS CAPITOL

Swearing-in Ceremony Marks the Beginning of the 85th Legislative Session

Austin – On Tuesday, January 10, 2017, State Representative Ryan Guillen (D-Rural South Texas) was sworn in for his eighth term in the Texas House of Representatives. Kicking off the 85th meeting of the Texas Legislature.

"Being entrusted with the responsibilities of this office is a very humbling thing," said Guillen. "I am honored to once again earn the confidence of the people of House District 31 and of Texas, and I'm determined to work vigorously to not let them down"

Guillen recited the Oath of Office Tuesday surrounded by his wife Dalinda, daughters Cinco and Viva, his father Mario and his wife Maria, and the other 149 members of the House.
