

2016-2017 Surety and Fidelity Industry Intern and Scholarship Program for Minority Students

Paid professional internships and competitive, merit-based scholarship awards of up to \$5,000 for outstanding minority students who show significant potential to become surety or fidelity professionals.

Overview/Background

Internships are provided by members of The Surety & Fidelity Association of America (SFAA) and scholarships are funded by contributions from member companies and other organizations and individuals. The objective of the intern and scholarship program is to provide surety/fidelity industry exposure and financial assistance to minority students who show significant potential to become surety or fidelity professionals. Surety and fidelity industry internships and scholarships are awarded once each year for the following academic year. All application materials must be received by November 15, 2016. The applicant is solely responsible for ensuring that all application materials are received on time. The Surety Foundation cannot be responsible for materials delayed or lost in the mail.

Eligibility

The Surety and Fidelity Industry Intern and Scholarship Program for Minority Students is available only to full-time undergraduate students at accredited four-year educational institutions. **Awards are granted based on merit (academic and personal achievement).** For purposes of this program, The Surety Foundation defines minorities as those of Black/African-American, Native American/Alaskan Native, Asian/Pacific Islander, or Hispanic ethnic origin. All applicants must be U.S. citizens.

PLEASE READ THESE INSTRUCTIONS AND THOSE ON THE FOLLOWING PAGES BEFORE YOU BEGIN TO COMPLETE THIS APPLICATION. The Surety Foundation cannot process and will not consider incomplete or incorrectly submitted applications.

To be eligible for a Surety and Fidelity Industry Internship and Scholarship, you must be:

- Ideally, a declared accounting, economics, business/finance or insurance/risk management major with a minimum of a 3.0 grade point average on a 4.0 scale.
- A minority student (see definition above) who has satisfactorily completed at least 30 semester hours or equivalent of college work, *including at least six* (6) semester hours (or equivalent) in your major field; and
- Enrolled as a full-time undergraduate student (12 semester hours or equivalent) and willing to participate in a
 minimum of six weeks paid professional internship with a company in the surety/fidelity industry during the summer
 following notice of the award and prior to the September disbursement of the funds.

Academic Transcript Required

The transcript **must** indicate your major field of academic study, and it **must** contain grades for at least 30 semester hours or equivalent, *including at least six* (6) hours in your major field.

Payments

Finalists will be notified by email at the address provided on the application by the end of the first quarter with interviews for internship placements arranged soon thereafter. Upon completion of the summer internship and documentation of Fall Semester enrollment, award checks will be mailed during the month of September. Internships and scholarships are competitive on a year- to-year basis. You must apply each year.

Your internship/scholarship application cannot be processed unless you complete the application and fulfill all related requirements. Application packages must include a completed application, transcript(s) and a personal essay (500-1,000 words) as outlined in Section C. Once you have gathered the required documents, submit the completed package to The Surety Foundation electronically or at the mailing address *below*.

- Provide transcript(s) including Spring Semester grades and your major concentration of study. If you have attended more than one university, please provide a transcript from each college/university listed in Section B.
- 2. Complete Sections A, B, C and D of this application form. It is through this information that the selection committee will "get to know you." Please write clear, well-organized answers. *All responses (except signatures) must be typed or neatly printed.* **However, the essay must be typed.**
