


A streamlined architecture : 3 Key actions

WHY is student mobility important?



- Better knowledge of EU higher education
Improved linguistic skills, intercultural experience
Improved employability through recognition of qualifications & study periods abroad + placements
Exchange of knowledge, ideas, contacts



WHY is staff mobility important?



- **Improved competences**
- **Broader understanding of practices and policies across countries**
- **Enhance quality in teaching and learning**
- **Trigger changes in the modernisation and international opening of their educational institution**
- **Promotion of mobility activities for learners**



More mobility



International opening of Erasmus/higher education



- Continuation of Erasmus Mundus action 2
- No differentiation between intra-EU and international mobility
- Full streamlining of calendar and procedures, management by **National Agencies**
(N.B. In 2014 international mobility will be launched later)
- Use of same quality instruments: principles of the Charter
- ~ **135.000 student and staff** mobility flows expected between Programme and Partner countries
- Adapted grant levels
- Priorities of EU external action will apply

Improving the Erasmus+ quality framework

- **Reinforced learning/mobility agreements to ensure recognition**
- **Reinforced inter-institutional agreements (new template published in July)**
- **Partner countries: ECHE principles included in inter-institutional agreements (template to be published soon)**
- **Selection based on institutional plans and EU external priorities**

Student credit mobility



- All levels of higher education (Short cycle, Bachelor, Master, Doctoral levels)
- All disciplines
- From 3 to 12 months for studies
- From 2 to 12 months for traineeships
(not open to partner countries in first 2 years)
- Each student can benefit up to 12 months per study cycle

Student mobility



HE student credit mobility

HEIs to apply to their NA for:

- Sending mobility to Programme Countries
- Sending and **receiving mobility** to/from Partner Countries
(no NAs in Partner Countries)
- Individually or **within a consortium** (*extended to all types of mobility*)
