#### **Definition & Activities**

- Establishing community partnerships with Morton Grove and Niles community organizations including libraries, the North Shore Senior Center, the Niles Township ELL Parent Center, park districts, village departments, other school districts, chambers of commerce, businesses, and more;
- Engaging District 67 community members in dialogues on key topics that will influence decisions made by the Board of Education; and
- Involving parents and other community members in educational initiatives through school volunteer programs and other programs focused on student learning.

The cultural, civic, and intellectual resources of the community are important assets for the development of all our students and families. Enhancing our family and community partnerships is key to improving our educational results.

Our goal is to move forward with a common vision and shared responsibility for educating our children. Here are some ways you can get involved:

#### Community Partnerships

We have strong partnerships with many community organizations, village departments, and businesses. And, we are creating more all the time. Some of our most exciting activities for the 2014-2015 school-year include:

- Partnership with the Niles Township ELL Parent Center, which offers ESL/literacy classes, access to community resources, and parent education
- Hynes Elementary students partnering with the North Shore Senior Center and the Morton Grove Public Library on an intergenerational book study
- Golf Middle School students partnering with the North Shore Senior Center to participate in the Active Aging Walk at Harrer Park
- Village Greening, a cooperative, intergovernmental initiative within the village of Morton Grove to promote energy conservation and sustainability across the Village
- Morton Grove Farmers' Market: The first Golf School District 67
   Community Day on September 20<sup>th</sup> from 8:00 am 12:00 pm.
- Morton Grove Park District events like Park Pride Day and Oktoberfest
- Kindergarten Career Week: welcoming local residents into the classrooms to share information about their careers

#### **CEC Dialogue Series**

The purpose of the community dialogue process is to give our community the opportunity to discuss key topics related to the



overall strategic direction of the District.

Community discussions will focus on issues that are aligned with the **District's strategic plan and have a broad, community**-wide impact including: student achievement and instruction, district finances and facilities, a safe and secure learning environment and other topics **relevant to educating today's students. The Board will also listen** closely to the broader community about discussion topics of interest.

Dialogue sessions will provide introductory information on the topic at hand followed by sufficient time for discussion. Key takeaways from the sessions will come to the full Board of Education for consideration and action if appropriate. The takeaways will also help inform decisions made by District administration.


