
Beacon Hill at Eastgate Has Plans for Expansion

The expansion is part of the original building plan submitted to the city and the neighborhood in 2006

Beacon Hill at Eastgate has plans to expand its building on the 20.7 acre site that occupies most of the corner of Boston and Plymouth.

The retirement facility, which opened in the fall of 2010, has reached capacity.

Breton Village mainstay is closed its doors after 38 years of selling children's books

On March 26 an email was sent to Pooh's Corner patrons stating, "After selling books to your families for 38 years, we are very sad to announce that Pooh's Corner will close."

The email went on to say, "Our booksellers have sold you the best in children's literature for decades and we hope that you have cherished us as much as we have cherished all of you."

The Breton Village mainstay has been in business since 1976. Initially, it was operated by Christian book publisher Baker Book House. Eleven years ago,

longtime store managers Sally Bolthuis and Camille DeBoer purchased the store.







New Tenants in a New Breton Village



New retail space is under construction between Fifth Third Bank and Leigh's

Breton Village is expanding its footprint, adding new retail space to the corner of Burton and Breton. Lululemon Athletica and Hot Mama are two tenants who will be occupying the new retail space. Both retailers will be moving from Gaslight Village in East Grand Rapids.

Lululemon's has been operating out of a temporary location for the past year and a half, and will anchor the new space. Hot Mama is coming to Breton Village after seven years in Gaslight Village. Its new location will be 40% larger.

Both retailers are coming from leases that were owned by CWD Real Estate Investment, the same group that owns Breton Village.

According to the CWD website, "The new, singlestory building will feature terra cotta siding accents, aluminum storefronts, and an outside plaza for yoga." Construction is currently underway, and completion is expected in the fall.

Earlier this year both Naked Plates and Breton Village Travel relocated away from the mall, and Pooh's Corner closed its doors on May 11.

The Streets Tax & Mulick Park

Thanks to the overwhelming passage of the streets tax, the Mulick Park Neighborhood-School Initiative is inline to launch a Safe Routes to Schools campaign in partnership with the Grand Rapids Christian Schools.

One of the goals identified by neighbors and school staff is the need to improve traffic flow, bus pick up/drop off, and overall walkability/bikeability.

Safe Routes to Schools is a federal initiative administered at the state level through the Michigan Department of Transportation and the Michigan Fitness Foundation. Safe Routes to Schools provides opportunities to leverage federal dollars for community-school planning, infrastructure improvements (sidewalks, streets, curb cuts, etc.), marketing, signage, and more.

The catch is there is a local match that is required that neither the school district nor City of Grand Rapids had money available to cover—until now. As part of the streets tax, City Commissioners approved guidelines that spelled out how a portion of the tax dollars would be used for Safe Routes to Schools.

This is yet another opportunity to further feed the excitement around Mulick Park. Stay tuned for more in the coming months!
