

Day 1: Tuesday, April 15, 2014 Quito, Ecuador - Tour Begins Begin in Quito, a UNESCO World Heritage site and Ecuador's stunning capital city.

Day 2: Wednesday, April 16, 2014 Quito
Tour Quito's colonial center, including the Presidential Palace and 17th-century church of La Compañía • Meet your fellow travelers at a welcome lunch overlooking the Pululahua volcanic crater • Cross between hemispheres at the Equatorial Line Monument and Museum at the "Middle of the World" • Try some "helado de paila," a local ice cream

specialty • Spend the rest of the day at leisure. (B, L)

Day 3: Thursday, April 17, 2014 Quito - San Cristóbal Island, Galapagos - Embark Ship Fly to beautiful San Cristóbal Island, gateway to your Galapagos adventure • Enjoy lunch aboard the *m/v Galapagos Legend* • At Port Baquerizo Moreno, visit the Museum of Natural History where you will learn everything from the islands' volcanic origins to the arrival of various species • After discovering the story of the Galapagos, stargaze from the deck of your ship and toast the wonders of the



Galapagos with tropical cocktails. (B, L, D)

Day 4: Friday, April 18, 2014 Española Island (Gardner Bay and Suarez Point)

Board your panga to visit Gardner Bay • Guarded by a colony of sea lions, the beach is home to Galapagos hawks and endemic finches • Swim and snorkel with the marine life, including manta rays and white-tipped sharks • Continue to the volcanic terrain of Suarez Point • During a nature walk, watch for hooded mocking birds, lava lizards, Sally Lightfoot crabs and blue-footed boobies • Count Waved Albatross at the world's largest colony • Finally, visit the Soplador blowhole where water shoots 75 feet into the air. (B, L, D)

Day 5: Saturday, April 19, 2014 Floreana Island (Post Office Bay and Cormorant Point)

Land at storied Post Office Bay, named for a barrel left in 1793 by Captain James Colnett as a "post office" for passing sailors • Continue the tradition and leave a letter • Snorkel if you choose with green sea turtles or search for Darwin's finches and yellow warblers • Sail to Cormorant Point and its olivine green sand beach • Spot sting rays and reef sharks in the emerald waters • Learn about the ecosystem's unusual plants • You may also observe graceful flamingos or spot a small colony of penguins • Enjoy

another chance to snorkel and swim near the playful sea lions! (B, L, D)

Day 6: Sunday, April 20, 2014 Santa Cruz Island (Charles Darwin Research Station and Highlands)

Visit the Charles Darwin Research Station • See the giant tortoises from the station's breeding program • Trek through the Santa Cruz highlands to Cerro Chato and find more giant tortoises • Savor some organic Galapagos coffee • Walk inside dormant lava tubes to gain insight on how these islands formed • Enjoy time to explore Port Ayora town. (B, L, D)

Day 7: Monday, April 21, 2014 Daphne Island - Disembark Ship - Baltra Island - Guayaquil

Garner panoramic views as you circumnavigate Daphne Island • Look for marine iguanas, fur seals and crabs teetering along the rocky shore • Bid farewell to the Galapagos and fly to Guayaquil • Tour this community known as the "Pearl of the Pacific" • Visit the Malecón 2000 waterfront area and the 19th-century neighborhood of Las Peñas with its Spanish-style houses • From Santa Ana Hill, look out over the city and the Guayas River. (B, D)

Day 8: Tuesday, April 22, 2014 Guayaquil - Lima, Peru Fly to Lima, Peru's "City of Kings" • Spend an afternoon shopping or visiting Lima's many fine museums • Perhaps you'll experience an optional

Peruvian Paso horse exhibition, dinner and folklore show. (B)

Day 9: Wednesday, April 23, 2014 Lima - Cuzco - Sacred Valley of the Incas Fly to Cuzco • Descend through the Andes to the Sacred Valley of the Incas, once the agricultural center of a great empire • Visit Awana Kancha, a living museum of the Peruvian Andes • Explore centuries-old methods of spinning, dyeing and weaving textiles • Stop in Pisac village to browse the handicraft market • Visit Pablo Seminario Ceramic Studio • Marvel at this internationally-renowned artist's techniques and designs, inspired by ancient Peruvian cultures • Settle into your hotel nestled in the Sacred Valley. Ollantaytambo - Sacred Valley of the Incas Glimpse daily activities at a nearby village and connect with another culture • Visit the Ollantaytambo ruins, a spectacular example of Inca architecture • Do as the locals do and enjoy a tasting of "chicha," a regional drink made from maize, at a local pub. Please see pricing for upgrade fees. Single accommodations are limited and will be confirmed upon request and availability from the cruise line.

Note that a cruise ship has a limited quantity of cabins available in each cabin category. We will make every effort to accommodate your cabin category preference at the time of booking. If the cabin category preferred is not available at the time of booking, the next closest category available will be offered and a surcharge may apply.

To complete your vacation, we include roundtrip airport-to-hotel transfers when purchasing Explorations airfare with your tour. If you have arranged for your own air, we are pleased to provide you the option of purchasing these transfers. Please note that all transfers will leave at pre-scheduled times.

Smaller buses, which may not be lavatory equipped, may be used on this program. In this case, frequent stops are made during travel periods.

Due to flight schedules, a post night in Lima or a pre or post night (unescorted) may be required in Miami (at an additional cost). Please inquire at time of booking.

In general, hotels in Peru (outside of Lima) are small with one or two levels and do not have elevators which may require you to climb 10-15 steps to get to/from the room.

The internal flights on this program in Ecuador and Peru are not included in the land price and must be purchased with the air portion of your vacation. Internal flights that are purchased will be ticketed and distributed on tour by your tour manager. For passengers wishing only to purchase inter air from us, own air must be arranged into Quito and out of Lima. Required inter flights include five segments: Quito-San Cristóbal Island, Baltra Island-Guayaquil, Guayaquil-Lima, Lima-Cuzco, Cuzco-Lima.


Suggested tipping on board cruise: \$15 USD per person, per day, for the on-board crew and \$8 USD per person, per day, for the naturalist guides.

The Inca Terraces at Moray and the Sacred Valley Salt Mines

Discover the enigmatic circular terraces at Moray and the amazing sight of the "Salineras" salt mines in the Sacred Valley during your half day adventure from Cuzco. Venture off the beaten path, journeying past quaint villages, spectacular Andean vistas and wide open fields of Peruvian crops. When you arrive at the Inca Terraces at Moray, explore each level of this artistically-designed Incan construction using the original Inca stone stairs! The concentric ring terraces and their meaning to the Incas will mesmerize you. These terraces were perhaps used as an experimental agricultural development site by the Incas; the rings are set deep into the earth so that each terrace reaches a different microclimate.

Wind down the hillside towards Urubamba and behold the awe-inspiring Salineras salt pans! Behold thousands of individual ancient salt mines carved into the terraces cascading down the mountain. An underground spring fills the pools causing the salt to crystallize as the water evaporates. As a result, a white quilt work pattern covers the hillside. Since Incan times, families have passed down ownership of the pools and have made a living from this special place. A truly unique sight to behold, you will never forget your exploration of this remote and spectacularly unique phenomenon.
