Work at Design HHW involved networking to secure work, managing work and cash flows, preparing initial appraisals, feasibility studies, visualisations, planning submissions, building control and construction drawings, and provide on-site training in low-impact construction techniques during build phases. Projects included off-grid educational facilities and neighbourhood-scale retrofit of existing housing stock, as well as a self-built, off-grid bunkhouse in which to live for the duration of our employment.

Led on a variety of tasks for the pan-European R-Urban project

Working in Paris, Romania and London, I have prepared feasibility studies and prototypical detailed designs using re-claimed materials, for experimental, community-run buildings in both urban and rural settings.
