## **Minister** focuses on fish and farming

Ramsay talks to Chamber

David Ramsay, the Minister of Industry, Tourism and Investment, gave an upbeat speech in Hay River on Aug. 26, touting the GNWT's contribution to the local economy.

In particular, Ramsay in an address to the Hay River Chamber of Commerce pointed to two initiatives specific to Hay River that the GNWT is working to have in place before the 17th Legislative Assembly expires on Oct

The first is a formal strategy document on agriculture, while the second is a business plan for the growth and revital-

Ramsay noted that last year, the federal government announced \$2 million to establish a permanent campus in Hay River for the Northern Farm Training Institute and up to \$2 million toward the inch of the Northern Greenhouse Initiative to advance greenhouse projects across the NWT.

"This summer, the Department of ITI completed a public engagement and consulta-tion process

to inform its drafting a formal Agriculture Strategy and Action Plan," said Ramsay, noting he is bringing the results back to the legislative assembly

in the fall. "Our strategy, when it is presented, will not focus on securing large quantums of land for commercial farm operations," he said. "That is not something that is seen as viable - and it is not what NWT residents have said is

needed or warranted."

Instead, the goals of the strategy will be to sow the seeds for investments and initiatives that will increase the availability of local food, reduce the cost of food, encourage and support the transfer of food production skills, incorporate the NWT's traditional food gathering activities and support sustainable food pro-

As for fishing, Ramsay said the fishers and producers on Great Slave Lake have completed their revitalization stratrcial fishery.

"Safe to say, it is ambitious and presents a significantly different approach than we have seen in the past - vesting NWT fishers directly in the challenges and success of their fishery," he said. "The plan aims to not only serve markets both north and south, but to contribute as partners to the marketing efforts of the Fresh-water Fish Marketing Corpora-tion. Meanwhile, our fishers will assume the responsibility of both the plant and oper-ations in Hay

implement the plan, but it has the support of both the fish marketing corporation and the GNWT. Ramsay hopes to work with industry to leverage the federal government for a significant portion of that money. The minister said he is looking forward to bringing the strategy to the legislative assembly when it convenes for a final time in September.

"This is a new and exciting direction for the fishery, for Hay River and for the NWT,"

Ramsay praised the business community in Hay River as being committed and equipped to move the community's economy forward.
