



WHY IS THE PROPER CHILD I.D. SO IMPORTANT?

One of the most important tools for law enforcement when searching for a missing child is an up-to-date, good quality photo along with the child's fingerprints and descriptive information. A Child ID is a simple yet effective tool to help families maintain current photos of, and descriptive information about their children.

To help parents, guardians, and law enforcement officials who are working hard to keep our children safe, the Palm Beach Sheriff's Office is pleased to offer this valuable and FREE service to children from 18 months to 14 years of age. Parental/guardian permission must be obtained before the child will be serviced. The event organizer will have the responsibility in obtaining this permission.

Maintaining an updated Child I.D. is an easy and effective way for families to have crucial and current information needed by authorities in case of a missing child, a natural disaster, or other emergency where families might become separated from one another.

The Palm Beach County Sheriff's Office does not retain any Child I.D. information.

All of your child's information is deleted at the end of the event.

Each sheet comes with two (2) ID cards.

Store remaining document with your personal files.

It is the parent's responsibility to update the I.D. information yearly.



HOW TO SCHEDULE AN EVENT

Requirements:

- Minimum of 20 children
- Signed parent's permission or present during fingerprinting
- 18 months to 14 years of age
- Indoor facility
- Must provide electricity
- Provide a 6 foot table
- Provide a minimum of 4 chairs
