Ash Wednesday Sermon Outline – February 10, 2016 Wrestling With God

Genesis 32:22-32 Colossians 1:21-23a Matthew 26:36-46

- 1. Why is the account of Jacob wrestling with God one of the craziest stories in the Bible?
- 2. Do you agree that most everyone has wrestled with God over issues or experiences in their lives? Why?
- 3. You are encouraged to fill out a "Wrestling With God" card and turn it so that it may be used in shaping the sermons for this series.
- 4. Why do we think the "man" who wrestles with Jacob is God?
 - Let the Bible interpret the Bible, especially the immediate context. In verse 30 Jacob indicates that the man is God. Jacob names the place "Peniel" meaning "face of God."
 - Also Hosea 12:3-5 indicates that the man Jacob wrestled with was an angel who is identified as God. An angel is a messenger of God and in the Bible when an angel shows up, people consider the angel to be God.
 - An angel of God appears in human form in other places in the Bible.
 Genesis 18.
- In verse 25, the man's wrenching of Jacob's hip socket appears to be a supernatural act.
- In verse 29 the discussion about knowing the man's name is like other discussions where knowing God's name is a big deal. Exodus 3:13-15
- Jacob asks for and receives a blessing and new name which is what only God does.
- In Genesis 35:9-15 there is a reprise of God's blessing and renaming Jacob and God is clearly stated there to be the one doing this.
- Why would this be such a big deal if it was just a man?
- We know that God appears in human form to bless us and his name is Jesus.

- 5. A primary question for this account: What is the issue or experience over which Jacob is wrestling with God?
 - What appears to be the initial answer?
 - What is the answer given in verse 25?
- 6. What is the take away from this sermon?
 - How is this take away illustrated in the story?
 - Why is this a helpful part of the story?
 - What does Colossians 1:21 teach?
 - Again, the great take away ...
