

Suggested Checklist of Information to Review with Parents/Guardians for Students Pending Non-Public School Placement

- Students **MUST** be affiliated to a NYCDOE school

- Home Instruction provides **5 hours a week** of instruction for elementary school students (grades K-6)

- Home Instruction provides **10 hours a week** of instruction for secondary school students (grades 7-12)

- An adult chaperone (18 years or older, other than the student) must be present at all times when a teacher is in the home. If a chaperone is not available, instruction can be provided in a public place near the child's home.

- High School Academic Policy states that ALL students be provided the opportunity of 54 hours of instructional time for each high school credit

- For high school students, a transcript and program from the last school of attendance must be provided

- Parents/guardians should provide written consent for Home Instruction

- Home Instruction is an interim program and **does not** grant diplomas. The affiliated school will grant the student diploma.

- The school of affiliation must complete the Home Instruction Referral Form (Chancellor's Regulation A-170 Attachment no. 1)

- The affiliate DOE school is responsible for providing PE modules and lessons while a student is on home or hospital instruction. Students' medical condition and length of time on home or hospital instruction should be taken into consideration when planning standards-aligned PE lessons. PE modules are graded by the affiliate school and overseen by the home and hospital instructors in accordance with the student's academic plan
