Autosomal DNA (atDNA) testing examines over 700,000 DNA markers on your chromosomes and allows you to compare your DNA with that of other people. If you are genetically related, you come up as a match to each other. There are now more than 3 million people in the various databases and this is helping people to reconnect with long lost cousins, many of whom have genealogical evidence that is helping other people break through their Brick Walls. This presentation looks at how you can use atDNA in your own family tree research, how to interpret your results, and what to do next.

Learning points:an understanding of atDNA compared to Y and mtDNA; how to navigate the FTDNA matches page; how to use a step by step approach to your atDNA results; the importance of having an online tree or pedigree to share with collaborators

DNA & RESEARCHING SURNAMES

Dr Maurice Gleeson

Y-DNA is passed from father to son and is an excellent way of tracing surnames back in time (both follow the father's father's father's line). The two types of DNA marker (STRs & SNPs) will be discussed and their application in surname studies will be explored. We will also take a look at haplogroup studies and what everyone should do after getting their results. As more and more people do SNP testing, the results are beginning to reveal new insights about the human evolutionary tree and these will be explored in relation to Irish surnames. Recent work on the Gleason/Gleeson DNA Project will be examined as an example as it has uncovered origins that date back to about 1200AD, telling us a lot about the surname, its origins and which Gleesons are most closely related to which other Gleesons.

Learning points: Y-DNA inheritance, the different types of Y-DNA markers, how to get the most out of your Y-DNA results through surname & haplogroup projects, when & why to do additional Y-DNA testing

The talk will also cover the Griffith's Valuation Maps, the Road Maps and the Satellite Maps and explain what each map covers and how to read that map with regard to ancestry research (historical, transport and current landscape respectively). The talk will then conclude with what to look for in the maps as well as how to overlay them in the OSI site. The Landed Estates Database will be shown where some of those estates were (based upon their XY coordinates) and possibly discuss the families' locations.
