## **ROH - Eligibility**

ROH registration is by examination. Eligibility for the examination is based on having one of the following combinations of academic qualification and professional experience:

<b>Academic Qualification</b>	<b>Professional Experience</b>
PhD (occupational hygiene or equivalent)	2 years
PhD (acceptable science or engineering)	3 years
Master (occupational hygiene or equivalent)	3 years
Master (acceptable science or engineering)	4 years
Bachelor (acceptable science or engineering)	5 years

Professional experience may only be claimed for periods in which the applicant was primarily (more than 50% of each year) engaged in the professional practice of occupational hygiene or closely related activities. Two references from ROHs or other suitably accredited persons such as CIH, CRSP, CSP must be provided.

## **ROH Fast Track- Eligibility**

Eligibility to challenge the multiple choice portion of the ROH examination is based on graduation from one of the following post secondary occupational hygiene programs from the following universities across Canada:

- University of British Columbia
- University of Toronto
- McGill University
- Université de Montréal

After the necessary experience requirement in the field practicing occupational hygiene based on the table above is met, the candidate may challenge the written portion of the ROH exam and the interview.
