Learning Objectives

Participants will:

- Understand the different court proceedings that involve the issue of hoarding, including civil injunctions, criminal and eviction cases;
- Be able to describe how fair housing law applies to hoarding situations and the reasonable accommodations request process;
- Understand different approaches through case management and litigation that can help reduce recidivism in litigants with hoarding disorder.

Continuing Education: This course has been approved by the Supreme Court of Ohio Commission on Continuing Legal Education for 3.50 total CLE hours instruction. Application has been made for 3.5 (three and one half) continuing education credits for building / property maintenance inspectors (ICC), social workers, and registered sanitarians (RS).



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

Speakers

The Honorable Raymond L. Pianka



Judge Raymond L. Pianka was elected in 1995 to serve as the Judge for the Cleveland Municipal Housing Court, where he has implemented many innovative programs aimed at increasing compliance with the City of Cleveland's building, housing and health codes. He has instituted the Selective Intervention Program, an alternative to prosecution to homeowners with first-time code violations who are brought into Housing Court. Landlords that appear in court are often ordered to attend a court-sponsored workshop that provides information on how to improve the management of rental property. Some investors who own blighted properties have been sentenced to the workhouse or ordered to serve house arrest in the actual dilapidated property.

The Honorable Daniel Hawkins



Judge Dan Hawkins was born and raised in Columbus' Sharon Woods neighborhood. After graduating from the Ohio State University's College of Law, he was selected to serve in the Franklin County Prosecutor's prestigious Special Victim's Unit and was later chosen to lead the unit as its Director. Since taking the bench, Judge Hawkins has worked to develop new sentencing strategies to combat vacant and abandoned properties in Franklin County. He is taking new approaches to deal with the ever growing problem of chronic hoarding and has spear-headed a new neighborhood cleanup program which directs individuals with court-ordered community service to pickup trash in our communities.
