## Meeting Adjourned by Vickie Bright



The meeting of September 8 was called to

order by President Larry Dennis. After the opening protocol, the monthly presentation from Code **Enforcement** was presented. Supervisor Joel Saunders stated that Code Enforcement has assumed enforcement responsibilities for commercial and residential vehicles parked residential neighborhoods. It is a Class 3 misdemeanor to have any vehicle parked in a residential neighborhood, unless that vehicle is doing explicit business in

that area. CE is currently patrolling for vehicles in violation and are giving warnings to violators. Thereafter, citations will be written. For more information regarding this new enforcement code, go to <a href="http://library.municode.com/index.com/inde

Article VII section 16.41.1 covers the parking of commercial vehicles in residential areas,.

The League was also happy to present guests Andy Stephenson, Sabine Brent, Grace Little, and Susan Zell from the Sentara Group, who provided a very informative presentation regarding the pro-

posed **Hospice Facility** extension, which is a part of the Sentara Village, in partnership with Sentara Way. The proposal is for an 8,311 sq ft facility to house 12 patients. There are currently only 3 such facilities in the state of Virginia, so this will be a welcomed addition to the Hampton Roads community. The proposed plans are expected to be submitted to the Planning Commission in November, and then submitted to City Council in December for a vote. If all plans are accepted as anticipated, construction could begin as early as January, 2012, with an anticipated completion by August/September.

## **Budget Proposal**

During the September 8 meeting, Larry Dennis presented a proposed



budget that was submitted by the Executive Board to be reviewed by the general membership. After an intensive review of the proposed budget, recommendations were made for adjustments. The results of the <u>revised</u> proposed budget can be found on page 7. This proposed budget will be up to vote at our next regularly scheduled meeting.



After years of planning, The Tide finally took off and it is exceeding expectations transporting hundreds of customers every day. For the first week, The Tide was free and city officials were unsure of how successful the light rail would be, and so far, so good. Now, some Virginia Beach citizens are urg-

ing city officials to consider bringing the train to the city.

Virginia Beach voters opposed light rail in their city 12 years ago, but new residents may help to sway the decision in the opposite direction.

An environmental and feasibility study is expected out in the first half of 2013.

Once it's analyzed and voters are properly educated, Virginia Beach Mayor William Sessoms says voters will get the



chance to weigh in via referendum.

## How to Protect Your Identity by Larry Dennis

This is Part 2 of a series to help protect your identity.



Place the contents of your wallet on a photocopy machine and make a copy. Copy both sides of your drivers license, credit cards, your passport, etc. and keep the photocopy in a safe place. This will enable you to know what you in your wallet and provide with all of the account

had in your wallet and provide you with all of the account and phone numbers so you can call to cancel or replace your cards. It will also provide proof that you had a passport.

File a police report immediately in the jurisdiction where your credit cards, passport, wallet, etc. were stolen. This proves to credit providers you were diligent, and is a first step toward an investigation, if there is a need for one.

Call one of the three national credit reporting organizations immediately to place a fraud alert on your name. (The company you call is required to contact the other two, which will place an alert on their versions of your report too.) Also call the Social Security fraud line number. The three national consumer reporting agencies are:
