*Note:* Exams and final grades will be not be curved or adjusted.

**Classwork: Quizzes, Homework, Attendance:** Attendance will be taken in the form of daily attendance quizzes. A typical quiz might consist of one of the following:

- assigned homework problems from the previous class periods or problems very similar to those on the homework,
- turning in homework problems at the beginning of class for that day's quiz,
- or a class (possibly group) activity.

*There will be no make-ups for missed quizzes.* At the end of the term, four quiz grades will be dropped to account for excused absences. If you have less than four absences at the end of the term, these drops will be applied to your lowest quiz grades.

*The best way to learn mathematics is to do mathematics.* The material covered in this course is not easy, and the best way for you to learn it is to work homework problems on a regular basis.

**Exams:** The exact dates for exams will be announced at least one week ahead of time in class (the tentative weeks for each exam are shown in the schedule below). Each student is expected to be present for each exam. If you have to miss an exam for an unavoidable, legitimate, and documented reason, you may be granted the opportunity to schedule a makeup exam. You are much more likely to be granted a make-up exam if you let me know about your excused absence (and provide documentation) *before* the exam.
