Elder

<u>Elders</u> - <u>NT:4245</u> πρεσβύτερος **presbuteros** (pres-boo'-ter-os); comparative of presbus (elderly); older; as noun, a senior; specifically, an Israelite Sanhedrist (also figuratively, member of the celestial council) or Christian "presbyter": **KJV** - elder (-est), old.

Exhorter

Exhort - ΝΤ:3870 παρακαλέω **parakaleo** (par-ak-al-eh'-o); from <u>NT:3844</u> and <u>NT:2564</u>; to call near, i.e. invite, invoke (by imploration, hortation or consolation):

KJV - beseech, call for, (be of good) comfort, desire, (give) exhort (-ation), intreat, pray.

<u>Elder</u> - <u>NT:4850</u> συμπρεσβύτερος **sumpresbuteros** (soom-pres-boo'-ter-os); from NT:4862 and NT:4245; a copresbyter: **KJV** - presbyter, also an elder.

Qualifications (cont)

1 Peter 5 (cont)

The <u>elders</u> which are among you I exhort, who am also an elder, and a **witness of the** <u>sufferings</u> of <u>Christ</u>, and also a <u>partaker</u> of the glory that shall be revealed:

Eye Witness

<u>Witness</u> - <u>NT:3144</u> μάρτυς **martus** (mar'-toos); of uncertain affinity; a witness (literally [judicially] or figuratively [genitive case]); by analogy, a "martyr": **KJV** - martyr, record, witness.

John 20

²⁹ Jesus saith unto him, Thomas, because thou hast seen me, thou hast believed: blessed are they that have not seen, and yet have believed.

Romans 1

²⁰ For the **invisible things** of him from the creation of the world are clearly seen, being **understood** by the things that are made, even his eternal power and Godhead; so that they are without excuse:

Hebrews 11

Emotional and Physical Suffering

Sufferings - NT:3804 πάθημα **pathema** (path'-ay-mah); from a presumed derivative of NT:3806; something undergone, i.e. hardship or pain; subjectively, an emotion or influence: $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$ - affection, affliction, motion, suffering.

<u>Christ</u> - <u>NT:5547</u> Χριστός **Christos** (khris-tos'); from <u>NT:5548</u>; anointed, i.e. the Messiah, an epithet of Jesus: **KJV** - Christ.

Extension of Christ

<u>Partaker</u> - <u>NT:2844</u> ΚΟΙνωνός **koinonos** (koy-no-nos'); from <u>NT:2839</u>; a sharer, i.e. associate: **KJV** - companion, ^x fellowship, partaker, partner.

1 Peter 4

¹³ But rejoice, inasmuch as ye are **partakers of Christ's sufferings**; that, when his glory shall be revealed, ye may be **glad also with exceeding joy**.

Expectant

Revealed - ΝΤ:601 ἀποκαλύπτω **apokalupto** (ap-ok-al-oop'-to); from NT:575 and NT:2572; to take off the cover, i.e. disclose: **KJV** - reveal.

2 Corinthians 1

⁴Who comforteth us in all our tribulation, that we may be able to comfort them which are in any trouble, by the comfort wherewith we ourselves are comforted of God.

⁵ For as the **sufferings of Christ abound in us**, so **our consolation also aboundeth by Christ**.

⁶ And whether we be afflicted, it is for your consolation and salvation, which is effectual in the enduring of the same sufferings which we also suffer: or whether we be comforted, it is for your consolation and salvation.

Responsibilities

Feed the Flock

1 Peter 5

² <u>Feed</u> the <u>flock</u> of God which is among you, <u>taking the oversight</u> thereof, **not by <u>constraint</u>**, but <u>willingly</u>; not for <u>filthy lucre</u>, but of a <u>ready mind</u>;

<u>Feed</u> - <u>NT:4165</u> ποιμαίνω **poimaino** (poy-mah'-ee-no); from <u>NT:4166</u>; to tend as a shepherd of (figuratively, superviser): **KJV** - feed (cattle), rule.

Flock - NT:4168 ποίμνιον **poimnion** (poym'-nee-on); neuter of a presumed derivative of NT:4167; a flock, i.e. (figuratively) group (of believers): **KJV** - flock.

Isaiah 40

¹⁰ Behold, the Lord GOD will come with strong hand, and his arm shall rule for him: behold, his reward is with him, and his work before him.

¹¹ He shall feed his flock like a shepherd: he shall gather the lambs with his arm, and carry them in his bosom, and shall gently lead those that are with young.

Take Oversight

Taking the oversight - NT:1983 ἐπισκοπέω **episkopeo** (ep-ee-skop-eh'-o); from NT:1909 and NT:4648; to oversee; by implication, to beware: $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$ - look diligently, take the oversight.

With desire

<u>Constraint</u> - <u>NT:317</u> ἀναγκαστῶς **anagkastos** (an-ang-kas-toce'); adverb from a derivative of <u>NT:315</u>; compulsorily: *KJV* - by constraint.

Willingly

Willingly - NT:1596 ἑκουσίως **hekousios** (hek-oo-see'-ose); adverb from the same as NT:1595; voluntarily: $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$ - wilfully, willingly.

Wisely

Filthy lucre - NT:147 αἰσχροκερδως **aischrokerdos** (ahee-skhrok-er-doce'); adverb from NT:146; sordidly [disreputable, (watch your reputation)]: $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$ - for filthy lucre's sake.

Proverbs 12

Responsibilities (cont)

Ready mind - NT:4290 προθύμως **prothumos** (proth-oo'-moce); adverb from NT:4289; with alacrity [eagerness, enthusiasm, readiness, quickness, speed, rapidity]: (Quick to respond) **KJV** - willingly.

John 21

¹⁵ So when they had dined, Jesus saith to Simon Peter, Simon, son of Jonas, lovest [agapao] thou me more than these? He saith unto him, Yea, Lord; thou knowest that I love [phileo] thee. He saith unto him, **Feed my lambs**.

...Pasture, graze my lambs

¹⁶ He saith to him again the second time, Simon, son of Jonas, lovest [agapao] thou me? He saith unto him, Yea, Lord; thou knowest that I love [phileo] thee. He saith unto him, **Feed my sheep**.

...Tend or shepherd my sheep

Being lords over - NT:2634 Κατακυριεύω **katakurieuo** (kat-ak-oo-ree-yoo'-o); from NT:2596 and NT:2961; to lord against, i.e. control, subjugate:

KJV - exercise dominion over (lordship), be lord over, overcome.

Heritage - NT:2819 κληρος **kleros** (klay'-ros); probably from NT:2806 (through the idea of using bits of wood, etc., for the purpose); a die (for drawing chances); by implication a portion (as if so secured); by extension an <u>acquisition</u> (especially a patrimony, figuratively); KJV - heritage, inheritance, lot, part.

Examples – NT:5179 τύπος **tupos** (too'-pos); from NT:5180; a die (as struck), i.e. (by implication) a stamp or scar; by analogy, a shape, i.e. a statue, (figuratively) style or resemblance; specifically, a sampler ("type"), i.e. a model (for imitation) or instance (for warning):

KJV - en- ex-) ample, fashion, figure, form, manner, pattern, print.

<u>Flock</u> - <u>NT:4168</u> ποίμνιον **poimnion** (poym'-nee-on); neuter of a presumed derivative of <u>NT:4167</u>; a flock, i.e. (figuratively) group (of believers): **KJV** - flock.

Of the Prophets

James 5

¹⁰ Take, my brethren, **the prophets**, who have spoken in the name of the Lord, for an **example of suffering affliction, and of patience**.

¹¹ Behold, we **count them happy which endure**. Ye have heard of the patience of Job, and have seen the end of the Lord; that the **Lord is very pitiful, and of tender mercy**.

<u>Chief Shepherd</u> - <u>NT:750</u> ἀρχιποίμην **archipoimen** (ar-khee-poy'-mane); from <u>NT:746</u> and <u>NT:4166</u>; a head shepherd: **KJV** - chief shepherd.

Appear - NT:5319 φανερόω **phaneroo** (fan-er-o'-o); from NT:5318; to render apparent (literally or figuratively):

KJV - appear, manifestly declare, (make) manifest (forth), shew (self).

Receive - NT:2865 κομίζω **komizo** (kom-id'-zo); from a primary komeo (to tend, i.e. take care of); properly, to provide for, i.e. (by implication) to carry off (as if from harm; genitive case obtain): $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$ - bring, receive.

<u>Crown</u> - <u>NT:4735</u> στέφανος **stephanos** (stef-an-os); from an apparently primary stepho (to twine or wreathe); a chaplet (as a badge of royalty, a prize in the public games or a symbol of honor generally; but more conspicuous and elaborate than the simple fillet, <u>NT:1238</u>), literally or figuratively: **KJV** - crown.

<u>Fadeth not away</u> - <u>NT:262</u> ἀμαράντινος **amarantinos** (am-ar-an'-tee-nos); from <u>NT:263</u>; "amaranthine", i.e. (by implication) fadeless: **KJV** - that fadeth not away.

Isaiah 28

- ¹ Woe to the crown of pride, to the drunkards of Ephraim, whose glorious beauty is a fading flower, which are on the head of the fat valleys of them that are overcome with wine!
- ² Behold, the Lord hath a mighty and strong one, which as a tempest of hail and a destroying storm, as a flood of mighty waters overflowing, shall cast down to the earth with the hand.

⁵ Likewise [similarly], ye <u>younger</u>, <u>submit</u> <u>yourselves</u> unto the <u>elder</u>. Yea, all of you be subject [submissive] one to another, and be clothed with <u>humility</u>: for God <u>resisteth</u> the <u>proud</u>, and giveth grace to the <u>humble</u>.

Younger - NT:3501 νέος **neos** (neh'-os); including the comparative neoteros (neh-o'-ter-os); a primary word; "new", i.e. (of persons) youthful, or (of things) fresh; figuratively, regenerate: **KJV** - new, young.

<u>Submit</u> - <u>NT:5293</u> ὑποτάσσω **hupotasso** (hoop-ot-as'-so); from <u>NT:5259</u> and NT:5021; to subordinate; reflexively, to obey:

KJV - be under obedience (obedient), put under, subdue unto, (be, make) subject (to, unto), be (put) in subjection (to, under), submitself unto.

Elder - ΝΤ:4245 πρεσβύτερος **presbuteros** (pres-boo'-ter-os); comparative of presbus (elderly); older; as noun, a senior; specifically, an Israelite Sanhedrist (also figuratively, member of the celestial council) or Christian "presbyter": $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$ - elder (-est), old.

Humility - NT:5012 Ταπεινοφροσύνη **tapeinophrosune** (tap-i-nof-ros-oo'-nay); from a compound of NT:5011 and the base of NT:5424; humiliation of mind, i.e. modesty: **KJV** - humbleness of mind, humility (of mind, loneliness (of mind). Resisteth - NT:498 ἀντιτάσσομαι **antitassomai** (an-tee-tas'-som-ahee); from NT:473 and the middle voice of NT:5021; to range oneself against, i.e. oppose: **KJV** - oppose themselves, resist.

Proud - NT:5244 ὑπερήφανος **huperephanos** (hoop-er-ay'-fan-os); from NT:5228 and NT:5316; appearing above others (conspicuous), i.e. (figuratively) haughty: $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$ - proud.

<u>Humble</u> - <u>NT:5011</u> Ταπεινός **tapeinos** (tap-i-nos'); of uncertain derivation; depressed, i.e. (figuratively) humiliated (in circumstances or disposition): **KJV** - base, cast down, humble, of low degree (estate), lowly.

Where God dwells

Isaiah 57

¹⁵ For thus saith the high and lofty One that inhabiteth eternity, whose name is Holy; I dwell in the high and holy place, with him also that is of a contrite and humble spirit, to revive the spirit of the humble, and to revive the heart of the contrite ones.

Characteristics (cont)

1 Peter 5

Whom God exalts

Exalt - NT:5312 ὑψόω **hupsoo** (hoop-so'-o); from NT:5311; to elevate (literally or figuratively): $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$ - exalt, lift up.

Due time - NT:2540 καιρός **kairos** (kahee-ros'); of uncertain affinity; an occasion, i.e. set or proper time:

KJV - $^{\chi}$ always, opportunity, (convenient, due) season, (due, short, while) time, a while. Compare NT:5550.

Characteristics (cont) Kindly Attentive

1 Peter 5

⁷Casting all your <u>care</u> [concerns] upon him; for he careth for you.

<u>Care</u> - <u>NT:3308</u> μέριμνα **merimna** (mer'-im-nah); from <u>NT:3307</u> (through the idea of distraction); solicitude: **KJV** - care.

Carefully Calculating

1 Peter 5

⁸Be <u>sober</u>, be <u>vigilant</u>; because your <u>adversary</u> the <u>devil</u>, as a roaring lion, walketh about, <u>seeking</u> [plotting] whom he may <u>devour</u>:

<u>Sober</u> - <u>NT:3525</u> $\nu \dot{\eta} \phi \omega$ **nepho** (nay'-fo); of uncertain affinity: to abstain from wine (keep sober), i.e. (figuratively) be discreet: **KJV** - be sober, watch.

<u>Vigilant</u> - <u>NT:1127</u> γρηγορεύω **gregoreuo** (gray-gor-yoo'-o); from <u>NT:1453</u>; to keep awake, i.e. watch (literally or figuratively):

KJV - be vigilant, wake, (be) watch (-ful).

Adversary - NT:476 ἀντίδικος **antidikos** (an-tid'-ee-kos); from NT:473 and NT:1349; an opponent (in a lawsuit); specially, Satan (as the arch-enemy): **KJV** - adversary.

Devil - NT:1228 διάβολος **diabolos** (dee-ab'-ol-os); from NT:1225; a traducer; specially, Satan [compare OT:7854]: **KJV** - false accuser, devil, slanderer. Seeking - NT:2212 ζητ $\hat{\epsilon}$ ω **zeteo** (dzay-teh'-o); of uncertain affinity; to seek (literally or figuratively); specially, (by Hebraism) to worship (God), or (in a bad sense) to plot (against life):

KJV - be (go) about, desire, endeavour, enquire (for), require, (X will) seek (after, for, means). Compare NT:4441.

<u>Devour</u> - <u>NT:2666</u> καταπίνω **katapino** (kat-ap-ee'-no); from <u>NT:2596</u> and <u>NT:4095</u>; to drink down, i.e. gulp entire (literally or figuratively):

KJV - devour, drown, swallow (up). [knowledge].

³ For I say, through the **grace given** unto me, to every man that is among you, **not to think of himself more highly than he ought to think**; but to **think soberly**, according as **God hath dealt to every man the measure of faith**.

⁹Whom <u>resist</u> <u>stedfast</u> in the faith, knowing that the same <u>afflictions</u> are <u>accomplished</u> in your brethren that are in the world.

Resist - NT:436 ἀνθίστημι **anthistemi** (anth-is'-tay-mee); from NT:473 and NT:2476; to stand against, i.e. oppose: $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$ - resist, withstand.

<u>Stedfast</u> - <u>NT:4731</u> στερεός **stereos** (ster-eh-os'); from <u>NT:2476</u>; stiff, i.e. solid, stable (literally or figuratively): **KJV** - stedfast, strong, sure.

Afflictions - NT:3804 πάθημα **pathema** (path'-ay-mah); from a presumed derivative of NT:3806; something undergone, i.e. hardship or pain; subjectively, an emotion or influence: $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$ - affection, affliction, motion, suffering.

Accomplished - NT:2005 ἐπιτελέω **epiteleo** (ep-ee-tel-eh'-o); from NT:1909 and NT:5055; to fulfill further (or completely), i.e. execute; by implication, to terminate, undergo:

KJV - accomplish, do, finish, (make) (perfect), perform (X -ance).

Of yourself

1 Corinthians 15

⁵⁸ Therefore, my beloved brethren, **be ye stedfast**, **unmoveable**, always **abounding in the work of the Lord**, forasmuch as ye **know that your labour is not in vain in the Lord**.

By Others

2 Corinthians 1

⁷ And our hope of you is stedfast, knowing, that as ye are partakers of the sufferings, so shall ye be also of the consolation.

Eternal - NT:166 αἰώνιος **aionios** (ahee-o'-nee-os); from NT:165; perpetual (also used of past time, or past and future as well):

KJV - eternal, for ever, everlasting, world (began).

<u>Suffered</u> - <u>NT:3958</u> πάσχω **pascho** (pas'-kho); including the forms (patho (path'-o) and pentho (pen'-tho)), used only in certain tenses for it; apparently a primary verb; to experience a sensation or impression (usually painful): *KJV* - feel, passion, suffer, vex.

Complete

<u>Perfect</u> - <u>NT:2675</u> καταρτίζω **katartizo** (kat-ar-tid'-zo); from <u>NT:2596</u> and a derivative of <u>NT:739</u>; to complete thoroughly, i.e. repair (literally or figuratively) or adjust:

KJV - fit, frame, mend, (make) perfect (-ly join together), prepare, restore.

Authenticated

<u>Stablish</u> - <u>NT:4741</u> στηρίζω **sterizo** (stay-rid'-zo); from a presumed derivative of <u>NT:2476</u> (like <u>NT:4731</u>); to set fast, i.e. (literally) to turn resolutely in a certain direction, or (figuratively) to confirm:

KJV - fix, (e-) stablish, stedfastly set, strengthen.

Confirmed and Proven

Strengthen - NT:4599 $\sigma\theta$ ενόω **sthenoo** (sthen-o'-o); from sthenos (bodily vigor; probably akin to the base of NT:2476); to strengthen, i.e. (figuratively) confirm (in spiritual knowledge and power): **KJV** - strengthen.

Settled

<u>Settle</u> - <u>NT:2311</u> θεμελιόω **themelioo** (them-el-ee-o'-o); from <u>NT:2310</u>; to lay a basis for, i.e. (literally) erect, or (figuratively) consolidate: $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$ - (lay the) found (-ation), ground, settle.

Ordained By God

1 Peter 5

¹¹ To him be glory and <u>dominion</u> for <u>ever and ever</u>. Amen.

Dominion - NT:2904 κράτος **kratos** (krat'-os); perhaps a primary word; vigor ["great"] (literally or figuratively): **KJV** - dominion, might [-ily], power, strength.

Ever and ever - NT:165 α iών **aion** (ahee-ohn'); from the same as NT:104; properly, an age; by extension, perpetuity (also past); by implication, the world; specially (Jewish) a Messianic period (present or future):

KJV - age, course, eternal, (for) ever (-more), [n-] ever, (beginning of the while the) world (began, without end). Compare NT:5550.

<u>Faithful</u> - <u>NT:4103</u> πιστός **pistos** (pis-tos'); from <u>NT:3982</u>; objectively, trustworthy; subjectively, trustful: **KJV** - believe (-ing, -r), faithful (-ly), sure, true.

<u>Suppose</u> - <u>NT:3049</u> λογίζομαι **logizomai** (log-id'-zom-ahee); middle voice from NT:3056; to take an inventory, i.e. estimate (literally or figuratively):

KJV - conclude, (ac-) count (of), + despise, esteem, impute, lay, number, reason, reckon, suppose, think (on).

Exhorting - NT:3870 παρακαλέω **parakaleo** (par-ak-al-eh'-o); from NT:3844 and NT:2564; to call near, i.e. invite, invoke (by imploration, hortation or consolation):

KJV - beseech, call for, (be of good) comfort, desire, (give) exhort (-ation), intreat, pray.

<u>Testifying</u> - <u>NT:1957</u> ἐπιμαρτυρέω **epimartureo** (ep-ee-mar-too-reh'-o); from <u>NT:1909</u> and <u>NT:3140</u>; to attest further, i.e. corroborate: **KJV** - testify.

Elected together - NT:4899 συνεκλεκτός **suneklektos** (soon-ek-lek-tos'); from a compound of NT:4862 and NT:1586; chosen in company with, i.e. co-elect (fellow Christian): **KJV** - elected together with.

benevolence; specially (plural) a love-feast:

KJV - (feast of) charity ([-ably]), dear, love.

Peace - NT:1515 εἰρήνη eirene (i-ray'-nay); probably from a primary verb eiro (to join); peace (literally or figuratively); by implication, prosperity:

KJV - one, peace, quietness, rest, + set at one again.
