Movie Review: La La Land is whimsical musical that charms, stirs emotion

Los Angeles is the City of Angels. And for those who hope to make it in Hollywood it's the City of Dreams.

I went to see La La Land earlier this week to find out what all the shouting is about. And I wasn't disappointed. I can understand why the movie written and directed by Damien Chazelle was nominated for 14 Academy Awards.

La La Land charms the audience with music, dancing, and acting. There are flights of fancy and fantasy sprinkled with a dash of drama, comedy, and romance

Gosling plays Sebastian, a pianist whose goal in life is to keep the old-style jazz genre alive. He dreams of opening his own club for jazz musicians to play what they want, when they want, how they want.

Stone portrays an aspiring actress who auditions, audition and auditions more until she finally lands a role that changes her career, and her life.

The movie offers old-fashioned entertainment - the kind that features the main characters suddenly breaking into song and dance. It harkens back to the golden days of the Hollywood musical but it is played out in a modern-day setting.

The opening scene is a dance number that's set on an L.A. freeway is a bit confusing at first, and it's a long film - two hours and eight minutes.

But with all its fantastical sequences La La Land serves as a reminder to never stop pursuing one's dreams.
