Jewish Home for the Aged *yahrzeit* cards Eric Lidji

If you've ever looked for your ancestors on the Pittsburgh Jewish Newspaper Project, you've almost certainly seen the "In Memoriam" section of the Jewish Home for the Aged. In each issue of the *Chronicle*, the Home would list the names of people who had *yahrzeits* in the upcoming week. Sometimes, the section also included the names of living relatives who had made contributions in memory of their deceased loved ones.

The usefulness of this section is limited, as far as genealogy is concerned. And the section often produces a lot of duplicate results, which can be frustrating when you're doing online research.

It turns out, though, that this section was just the public face of a valuable set of records. About two years ago, our friends at the Jewish Association on Aging—the current iteration of the Jewish Home for the Aged—found a stack of original *yahrzeit* application cards. There applications were used to compile this newspaper section and also to send out notices to family members, as the Hebrew *yahrzeit* approached each year.

Some record sets seem to have been designed with genealogists in mind, and this is one of them. Each card includes the name of the deceased (often in English and Hebrew), the date of death (often in the Gregorian and Hebrew calendars), and the name, address and relationship of all the family members who requested a notice each year.

It's a big collection. There are 2,562 cards. The dates stretch across the 20th century, and even include a few deaths from the late 19th century, before the Home was founded in 1905. To make this large set of records usable, our volunteer Amy Lowenstein spent weeks compiling a database of the English names and Gregorian dates of death for on every card. Then, our volunteer Sheila Kaufman alphabetized all the cards. Now, any card can be found within seconds.

It's an excellent resource. But there's a catch.
