



History -

Sultan Ghalib II was the last reigning Sultan of the Qu'aiti Sultanate, in full, Qu'aiti Sultanate of Shihr and Mukalla, in modern Yemen. It was was one of the largest sultanates in the British-protected Protectorate of South Arabia; its capital was the port of Al-Mukallā. His Highness reigned from October 11, 1966 until the monarchy was ousted by communists on September 17, 1967. As a result, members of the Royal Family were being forced to live in exile in Saudi Arabia.
