• Everyone must provide their own bedding. We have regular length, twin size bunk beds in our cabins.

- Bible, pen, notebook, soap, deodorant, sunscreen, camera, lake / shower towels, lake apparel (see dress code).
- Bring a calling card or stationary because the use of your cell phone is not allowed during camp.

We feel that scripture memory is vital for teenagers! They need to plant God's Word in their hearts to get them through the challenges that will come. Scripture will give wisdom, encouragement, hope and everything needed to those struggling.

At camp we ask students to memorize scripture from their curriculum binder (received at camp). Each student must quote a verse to get onto the dock each afternoon for lake time. And, to put our money where our words are, we daily draw from students who have memorized a scripture, and if they quote the scripture correctly, we'll give them a prize!

You can start now memorizing these scriptures...

Matthew 28:18-20, Acts 26:17b-18, 1 Peter 3:15 are key camp scriptures for every week.

SCRIPTURE MEMORY

Based on the training topic for the week (discipleship, evangelism, leadership, or reTHINKtruth), students will be given training outlines and answers throughout camp that they can memorize and quote them for a prize.

Throughout the week small groups will compete with each other to answer challenge questions and quote scriptures based on the daily training seminars. Then on the last day of camp, each small group will elect one of their members to represent the group in The BLITZ, a final "game show like" challenge to win the prize for them all! We believe in students hiding God's Word and truths in their hearts and minds!

MEDIA CHALLENGE

Beginning two weeks prior to camp, Fun in the Son Ministries challenges every student and adult to fast from all TV, movies, video games, music, and websites (including Facebook!). In place of these things, we challenge you to memorize scripture, pray, study the Word of God, witness to your friends and family, and do things that build the Kingdom of God.

We hear testimonies each summer of how those who participate in this fast feel they receive more from their camp experience because they had already filtered out the distractions of this world and focused on God. Some even chose to continue their fast, or parts of their fast, when they went home.

Every camper who completes the media fast and brings a completed media fast verification form will be entered into daily \$25 drawings at camp.

DRESS CODE The dress code is casual; shorts, shirts, sandals, and the like. LAKE: We require girls wear one piece suits or modest tankinis that are not low cut, backless, strapless, one strap or show any midriff. Girls can wear shirts over unapproved swimsuits while at the lake provided the shirt is never taken off and is not transparent, especially when wet. UPDATE: we now require all females to wear shorts over their swimsuit bottoms. Board shorts, Soffe shorts, athletic shorts, etc., are acceptable. There is no minimum inseam requirement for lake shorts. Swim bottoms have become smaller and, in many cases, are no longer appropriate to be worn in mixed company. No guys speedos are allowed. Lake apparel must be completely covered when not at the lake. At no time should guys be shirtless other than at the lake. CAMP: Ladies cannot wear strapless, spaghetti strap, or low cut tops or dresses. Transparent shirts must have a full non-transparent shirt underneath. Shorts will be longer than 3 inch inseam. Guys will wear shorts and pants high enough to cover their underwear. We do not allow apparel promoting crude, violent, or sexually explicit movies, TV shows, music artists, or the like. We will speak with you if rules are not followed.

INSURANCE We have a four-tiered insurance structure at Camp Table Rock. The first tier is each individuals personal family insurance. The second tier is the individuals home church insurance or the church they're attending camp with. The third tier would be the district's/group's insurance, if attending as a district or group. The final tier is Fun in the Son Ministries' insurance which is intended as the final safety net only.

CELL PHONES We do not allow students to use their cell phones at camp. They are expected to keep them in their bag, turned off. We want students to leave the distractions of the world behind and be solely focused on the LORD while here. There is a camp phone they can use with a calling card. The adults in each cabin will have their cell phone in case of emergencies.

LODGING Our air-conditioned cabins are divided by gender. Each cabin has bunk beds and full bathrooms.

MONEY All activities and meals are included in the price of camp! Bringing extra money for snacks or CTR souvenirs is totally optional! The Snak Shak offers CTR products like shirts, tanks, hoodies, sunglasses, water bottles, and more! It also has chips, candy, pop, ice cream, and other snacks.

To ensure everyone has a safe a time at camp, there are rules and guidelines we have set.

Students will be appropriately disciplined for:

- Possession and use of nonprescription drugs, alcohol, or tobacco.
- Intentional destruction or damage of property. You will also pay for the damages.
- Breaking curfew and sneaking out of cabins.
- · Guys in girls' cabins or girls in guys' cabins.
- · Possession or use of air horn or fireworks.
- Being on the dock or in the water any time other than staff supervised lake time.
- Fighting or causing intentional bodily harm to others.
- Disobedience to the instructions of an adult sponsor or staff member.
- Possession of sexually explicit material (magazines, movies, music, or on electronics).
- Skipping out on a worship service or training seminar.
- Wearing apparel with sexual connotations, alcohol logos, etc.
- Disobeying boating rules.
- Use of walkie-talkie, stereo, radio, computer, or cell phone.
- Inappropriate PDA.
- Feeding any camp pets.
- No pets are allowed. If you bring one, your pet will be sent home at your expense.
- Wearing an inappropriate outfit or swimsuit (see dress code).

Appropriate disciplines range from talking with the camp director to being sent home at the parents' expense.

We reserve the right to create new rules as we see fit and to enforce them. We also reserve the right to confiscate any material, including electronics or inappropriate apparel, as we see fit. If a camper cannot follow these rules, they will be sent home at the expense of their parent or guardian.
