Print Journal Articles:

Author's Last name, First Initial. (Year of Publication). Title of article. *Title of journal Italicized, Volume number italicized*, Page Numbers.

Film/Movies:

Director's last name, first initial. (Director [and producer, if applicable]). (Year film was made). Title of film [Medium]. Location of studio: Studio name.
