



Liberties Flash Fiction Competition: Terms and Conditions

1. The competition will be organised and administered by Liberties Festival Dublin (the “Organisers”).
2. Entry to the competition is open to everyone living on the island of Ireland. Entries must be written in English, or an English translation provided.
3. Entrants must write a piece of short fiction based on the theme “Liberties”. Entry is free of charge and entrants may submit as many entries as they wish.
4. Entries should be between 50-300 words. Entries must be submitted by email (in the body of the email, no attachments) to libertiesflashfiction@gmail.com Entrants should give the name by which they wish to be identified and their county of residence at the end of their entry, e.g. Dublin, Tyrone, Sligo, Cork.
5. The Organisers will only ever use personal details for the purposes of administering this competition.
6. Closing time for entries is 23:59 GMT on 13 July 2015.
7. All entries must be the original unpublished work of the entrant.
8. Entries must not contain anything which is calculated to bring the Liberties Festival Dublin into disrepute.
9. Entrants retain the copyright in their entries but grant Liberties Festival Dublin a non-exclusive licence to use their entry for publication on the Liberties Festival Dublin website as well as for any promotional purpose, e.g. inclusion in a forthcoming publication.
10. Entries will be judged by a team from Liberties Festival Dublin.
11. The winners will be contacted by a member of the Liberties Festival Dublin team within a ten day period of the competition closing, i.e. 23 July 2015. If the winner cannot be contacted after reasonable attempts have been made to do so, the Organisers reserve the right to offer the prize to the next best entry.
12. The overall prize for best entry is one Kindle e-reader. The prize for best entry written about The Liberties area in Dublin will receive two tickets to the Nighthawks event in the Guinness Storehouse, Dublin on Saturday 18 July 2015. There will be no cash alternatives. There will be no payment for any story that is chosen or published in any capacity.
13. The Organisers’ decision is final and no correspondence will be entered into.
14. The Organisers reserve the right to amend these Terms and Conditions or cancel this competition at any stage, if deemed necessary in its opinion, and if circumstances arise outside its control. In this event, a notice will be posted on the Liberties Festival Dublin website and/or Facebook page.
15. The Organisers, their sub-contractors, subsidiaries and/or agencies cannot accept any responsibility whatsoever for any technical failure or malfunction or any other problem with any server, internet access, system or otherwise which may result in any entry being lost or not properly registered or recorded. Proof of sending is not proof of receipt.
16. A reading and prize giving event will be held in Arthur’s Pub, Thomas Street, Dublin 8 on Wednesday 15 July 2015 at 6pm GMT. The event is free and all are welcome.
